

In the Name of God Amen I Isam Sellers of the County of Henderson & State of Kentucky now in perfect health, mind and memory turn to Almighty God for his name, and knowing the mortality of all mankind, and that it is appointed to all men to die, I do hereby make this my last will & Testament. In manner and form following: viz: 1st That all my just debts be paid. - 2nd I give unto the heirs of my deceased son John Sellers in addition to what I have heretofore given him, the sum of One Dollar. - 3rd I give unto my daughter Eliza Coltingham in addition to what I have heretofore given her, the sum of One Dollar. - 4th I give unto my son William Sellers in addition to what I have heretofore given him the sum of One Dollar. - 5th I give unto my son Lewis Sellers in addition to what I have heretofore given him the sum of One Dollar. - 6th I give unto Elizabeth Sutton in addition to what I have heretofore given her, the sum of One Dollar. - 7th I give unto the heirs of Orman Sellers deceased in addition to what I have heretofore given them, the sum of One Dollar. - 8th I give unto Dorcas Murphy in addition to what I have heretofore given her, the sum of One Dollar. - 9th I give unto David Sights in addition to what I have heretofore given him, all the Land that I possess on the same side of the Creek that he now lives. - 10th I give unto my beloved wife Lydia Sellers all the rest of my land that I now possess or may possess between this & my death. Also all my negroes for her use and benefit during her widowhood, together with all my household and kitchen furniture, farming utensils, and all the stock of what kind soever, that I may be in possession of, at my death, and also what meat I may have in my smoke house at the time of my death. Should my wife Lydia Sellers marry again then I desire that she shall have the third of my stock, household and kitchen furniture farming utensils, &c. - 11th The whole of my land and negroes that I may possess at my death I give unto my children begotten by my beloved wife Lydia Sellers, and after my wife's death, all the stock, household and kitchen furniture to be equally divided between & among them, notwithstanding I desire that my wife Lydia Sellers shall hold my household & kitchen furniture, farming utensils and the crop that may be growing, during her lifetime should she not marry again, but if she should, then she to have her third, and the children that I have begotten by her, to share the balance equally of said plantation. And I do hereby appoint Doctor Edmund Tibbets, Thomas Bowles & William Green my executors, hereby revoking all and every Will & Testament heretofore by me made, hereby ratifying this my last Will and Testament. I Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this first day of December in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and twenty seven.

Wm J. Murray Will

In the Name of God Amen. Know all men by these presents that I William J. Murray of Henderson County & State of Kentucky being weak in body, but sound in mind and memory, do make this my last will and Testament. - 1st It is my will & desire that all my just debts be paid. - 2nd I will & bequeath to my nephew William A. Church two hundred & twenty five acres of land lying on Green River deeded to me by my Father, if he die before his mother the said land is then to go to her and her heirs, with the privilege also of his mother residing on and clearing the land if it be necessary during her lifetime. - 3rd I also give to my nephew William A. Church One Certain Bed & Bed & furniture belonging to it. - 4th Also One barrel mares & Colt to be kept by his Father for his benefit. - 5th I give to my sister Sarah Barralon three hundred Dollars in money to be paid by my executor in June 1838 out of my estate. - 6th I give five Dollars to my sister Mary H. Williamson. - 7th Also five Dollars to my sister Elizabeth H. Mullin. - 8th Also One Dollar to my sister Matilda Bader. - 9th It is my will & desire that the balance of my estate not already disposed of, if any, shall be equally divided between my sisters Susan Church & Sarah Barralon. - 10th I name & appoint Edward Jones and Samuel Church executors to this my last will & Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affix my seal this 11th day of May 1837.
