 In the Name of God. Amen. I James H. Boswell of the County of Henderson and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory conscious that it is allotted for all men to die, and that no man knows how soon, and anxious while in health to make disposition of the property whereunto it has pleased the Supreme Disposer of death to bless me, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament as follows.

First. I give & bequeath my soul to the Beneficent Being who gave it me, and wish my body to be consigned to its kindred earth in Christian burial. Secondly, My Will and desire is, that out of the money and debts which shall be on hand at my death, my Executor shall pay all my just debts.

Third. I hereby Will and devise One hundred and fifty acres of land lying on Green River which was laid off by the Executor of my Father, according to the third clause in his Will, said hundred and fifty acres of land is to be equally divided between my Brother John H. Boswell and David L. Boswell and my late brother-in-law H. McFarland.

Fourth. I Will and devise the remainder of my property both real and personal to my Brother William B. Boswell.

Fifth. I hereby Revoke and annul all or any other last Will and Testament which I may heretofore have made.

Sixth. I hereby constitute and appoint my said Brother William B. Boswell my last Executor in Testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal, this 9th day of July in the year 1850 - after intaking the word "in" in the fifth line between the words "while" and "health".

 In the Name of God. Amen. I William Anthony of Henderson County, Town of Henderson, & State of Kentucky, being now in health, best of mind & disposing mind & memory, do make & Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner & form following. In the first place I recommend my soul to God who gave it, and my body to the earth, to be buried in a decent Christianlike manner.

Having already given and conveyed to my wife & children Considerable portions of my property, I do give and devise the remainder thereof as follows. I own three lots in the City of Evansville Indiana, to wit: Lots Nos 127 and 128 on the old plan of the town and 4th of lot No 165, and in the Town of Henderson Kentucky one half of lot No 21 containing half an acre & the whole of lot No 22 - containing One acre. I give and devise to my son Benjamin J. Anthony (usually called Frank) the west half of the lot No 127 in

the City of Evansville Indiana and the one half of lot No 128 in the Town of Henderson Ky. I give and devise to my son James H. Anthony the west half of my lot No 128 in the City of Evansville Indiana, and the west half of my lot No 22 in the Town of Henderson Ky, that is, the half lying on Main Street, opposite James & Ram Kins - I give and devise to my daughter Ellen M. Anthony the east half of my lot No 127 in the City of Evansville Indiana, and the west half of my lot No 22 in the Town of Henderson Ky, the half next the river. With respect to my daughter Deborah Bradford dec^d I advanced to her one lot in the Town of Henderson (half of lot No 11) One lot in the City of Evansville, One Negro girl worth \$500 and furniture & other things for house keeping when she was married, and since her death have conveyed to her four children Eighty acres of land in Vanderburg County, Indiana opposite the Town of Henderson, all of which I consider to be her full portion of my estate, and is all I intend to give her or her children. I give and devise to my wife Ellen J. Anthony the west half of my lot No 128 and the 4th of the lot No 165 both in the City of Evansville Indiana, also all my stock of every description, all my Carpenter Tools, & Household & Kitchen furniture and a farming Utensils. But it is intended that the said west half of lot No 128 & 4th of lot No 165 in the City of Evansville shall be charged with the payment of my just debts (all of which I desire to be paid) and for that purpose I desire my said wife, my Executor hereinafter named to sell the said west half of lot No 128 and the 4th of the lot No 165 in the City of Evansville, in any manner, on the best terms she can, and out of the proceeds thereof to pay all my just debts, and if the proceeds shall be more than sufficient to pay my debts, then the remainder or surplus shall be hers absolutely, or if she can pay my debts without the sale of said lots, then the said lots to be hers absolutely - she may also sell any of my stock for the payment of debts if she thinks proper. - I have heretofore given & conveyed my Negro Girl Slave Eliza to my daughter Ellen M. Anthony and my Negro Girl Slave Minty, to my wife Ellen J. Anthony, which gifts I do hereby confirm. I do hereby nominate and appoint my wife Ellen J. Anthony sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament - and direct that she shall not be compelled to have any public sale of my personal property nor to return any Inventory thereof, all of which I have given to her, and I further desire that my said wife shall not be required to give any security in executing of this my last Will & Testament. I do hereby revoke all, or any other Will or Wills by me heretofore made. I declare this to be my last Will and Testament. In Testimony whereof, I have hereunto subscribed my name, and affixed my seal, at my own house in the Town of Henderson, Kentucky, this 25 day of August A.D. 1850
