In the Name of God Amen. I Benjamin Wall of Henderson County & State of Ky. do make this my last Will & Testament in the following manner - Item 1st I give to the heirs my Daughter Lucy Petty One Negro Boy named Alexander; the Service of said Negro may be claimed by said Lucy provided she may want or wish them.

Item 2nd I give to my son Nelson Wall the tract of land I now live on which is the tract I bought from New Sandford son?

Item 3rd I wish said Peterson to support his Mother during life in a good and decent manner to be provided with every thing in a reasonable manner during her widowhood. - Item 4th I wish my said son Peterson to take Care of his Sisters Angelina & Frances so long as they may remain unmarried on the said Mamie house tract of land, or shall otherwise think proper to live with their Mother & myself.

Item 5th I give to Angelina Wall & her sister Jane Reader 54 ac of land lying on Green River as per patent to be equally divided between them. - Item 6th I give to my two daughters Angelina & Frances to each of them a Horse to be worth as much as the one I gave Jane Reader, also a Cow & Calf and Bed & bedding.

Item 7th I give to my son Peterson One bed with bedding of equal value with girls, also one Cow & Calf, also one mounted Saddle gun.

Item 8th I give to my wife One Negro woman named Gadette together with her youngest child during life, and at her decease to be divided equally between my sons Peterson, Angelina & Frances.

Item 9th I give to my Daughter Angelina a Negro girl named Lotty to her and her heirs forever. - Item 10th I give to my Daughter Jane Reader one Negro girl named Hannah to her and her heirs forever.

Item 11th I give to my daughter Frances one Negro girl named Dicy to her and her heirs forever. - Item 12th I give to my son Peterson One Negro boy named Bob or other called Robert to him forever. - Item 13th I give to my three sons Neal, Henry & Adkins Wall Henry, Nelson, Mary & James

to be equally divided between them forever. Item 14th I give to my wife one bed & bedding during her widowhood & at her death to be divided between my sons Nelson, Angelina & Frances. - Item 15th The property of Angelina & Frances I wish for to be kept together under the Care and Control of Peterson for their maintenance so long as they shall live unmarried. - Item 16th I give to my son Adkins twenty five Dollars out of the proceeds of my property. I wish my two sons Henry & Henry Wall be executors to this my last Will & Testament. - Given under my hand 19th of May 1836

In the Name of God Amen. I James M. Wall of Henderson County and State of Kentucky, being weak in body and knowing the uncertainty of this mortal life, do make, publish and declare this my last Will and Testament revoking all others of whatever tenor or date. In the first place it is my will and desire, that my two sons William M. Wall and Joseph M. Wall shall have and hold the land lying behind their River survey on to the front line and also the Negro Boys named Addison and Washington to be equally divided between them. Secondly it is my will and desire that my daughter Orinda M. Wall shall have and hold the land I have purchased from my son Samuel M. Wall together with the land lying behind it to the grant line, and also the land lying behind her twenty five acres, willed to her by her Father to the front line, but my deed not being lawfully executed to my son Samuel M. Wall, I empower my Executors to perform all that is wanting on my part to fulfill my Contract. - Also I bequeath to my daughter Orinda three hundred and fifty Dollars in Cash which I wish to be put to interest with the rent of her land, out of which it is my will she shall be educated; Also two good feather Beds and furniture.

Thirdly it is my will and desire, that all my house hold and Kitchen furniture together with my Stock of every kind, and farming utensils and the Crops, shall be sold and the money put to interest. Fourthly, I bequeath to my daughter Lawrence M. Wall my Negro girl named Sally, and also One hundred Dollars out of the Sale money, and the balance of the Sale money to be Continued on interest and the interest to be drew yearly by my two daughters Lawrence and Orinda until they marry, or until my two youngest sons, comes of age, at which time the principle of the Sale money shall be equally divided between them.

Lastly it is my will that any of my children dying without lawful issue their property shall return to the remaining part of my family. - I also appoint my son John M. Wall

I Joseph Dades of this County & State aforesaid now feeling the infirmity of afflictions & age, & calling to mind the uncertainty of life, & feeling disposed while in my right mind to do justice & to distribute my worldly goods while it hath pleased God to bless me with, in the following manner viz.

Item 1st I will & bequeath to Mary Craig, his wife Sarah One hundred acres of land, lying on the South side of my tract including a small improvement to them & their heirs forever - Item 2^d I will & bequeath to Signatus G. Lewis & wife Elizabeth One hundred acres of land lying North of P. Craig, adjoining the same to them & their heirs forever - also a negro girl now in their possession named Susan & some in my possession named Rody to them & their heirs forever - Item 3^d I will & bequeath to my wife Frances during her life the residue or balance of my land including my present residence & the farm lying towards W. Jones' also a negro named Baddel & one by the name of Henry & a woman by the name of Kelly, One by the name of City & her youngest child, also my Wagon & dearbox & all my farming implements & stock of any description, also the house hold & kitchen furniture, & at the death of my wife I will & bequeath to my son John Dades One hundred acres of land including my present farm of 20 acres of my last purchase late off in a square adjoining North West Corner of the above named farm, also two negroes, One by the name of Calie & one by the name of Emily, & to be understood that he is not to have possession of Calie until the year 1838

Item 4th I will & bequeath to John McMan One dollar - Item 5th I will & bequeath to my Grand Son Wm. W. Jones One hundred & 40 acres of land of my last purchase lying towards Mrs. Davis' to him & his heirs forever, also a negro Boy named Ben & a negro girl named Easton, also one Colt 1 year old last spring, One bad Span, & one horse.

Item 6th I will & bequeath to my Daughter Frances One hundred and sixty acres of land, the balance of my last purchase lying towards Washburn, also three negroes named Mary Ann, Anthony, & Elizabeth, an Old bed & furniture & also other furniture that she hath in possession.

Lewis & Daughter Frances, & the two young persons W. Jones are to have one share or one fourth, except the beds & furniture, which she can dispose of as she thinks proper.
