First: I will my body to the dust from whence it came. And my soul to God who gave it in the unwearied hope of eternal life. I leave to my wife all my real and personal estate of my Real Estate I ever gave or shall hereafter receive as to my estate & property with which it has pleased God to bless me I leave & bequeath to my beloved wife Aloncia Spencer for & during the term of her natural life upon the following terms & conditions to wit: I will my son R. B. Spencer continue to live on the place where he now lives & she will let my other sons as they arrive at age to get married settle on the other portions of my land as to her may be convenient and proper I will a portion of my said children mine as mine as to her may seem proper & advisable my stock of cattle horses mules sheep & hogs or money after repaying to herself a comfortable & easy support & dependent upon and upon and whereas my beloved Son George is now & shall be by marriage bound to all manner of his wife I will that all of her dower & other stock upon such a happening my wife shall have full & ample power to levy upon a portion of the place occupied by my said sons so in the aggregate to furnish her a good & independent support after the death of my wife it is my will & desire that my lands be divided between my three sons as follows R. B. Spencer to have the place he lives on containing 114 acres my son D. H. Spencer to have the same farm containing 120 acres my son George H. Spencer to have the same farm containing 120 acres the balance of my estate & what is to be equally divided between them

John D. Anderson of the County of Henderson in the State of Kentucky do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following hereby revoking all other and former wills by me heretofore made

First: My will and desire is that all my just debts be paid I do in addition to the gifts and conveyances heretofore made to my daughter and her husband I do hereby give and bequeath to her for her own separate use First share of my Real Estate in the Farmers Bank of Kentucky this she is to control after her own free will her individual transfer of the same or her individual receipt for same and on the same shall be as valid as though she were a free soul I also give her my work beast and Buggy harness all my household and kitchen furniture all my wearing apparel

I give and bequeath to my son-in-law Martin A. Towles Esq my Gold watch and chain and Gold spectacles to be kept by him as long as he lives and to be given by him to the eldest son of my daughter Susan I also give to him before the death of my daughter Susan a pair of silver hands which have been in my family from before the American Revolution I also give him in fee simple First share of stock in the Farmers Bank of Kentucky

And I give and bequeath to my son-in-law Lucy A. Stephens my clock First I give and bequeath to my daughter Susan after named my servant girl Fannie to be held by him up to the following term and condition she shall be entitled to receive all her earnings she shall have hold and possess in her own right all her clothing and furniture including her wardrobe bedstead and bedding in fact to be treated as a free woman as near as the law will allow it to long as she remains in the State of Kentucky And if at any time she may elect to emigrate to Liberia or any State or Territory within the United States it shall be and it shall be made the legal duty of my said executor to see that she is furnished with all necessary and proper papers to show her right and title to freedom And for this purpose I hereby give and bequeath to said Executor One hundred dollars and whatever amount of said sum remains unexpended after furnishing her necessary free papers is to be paid over to her

And I do hereby give and bequeath to my son-in-law Martin A. Towles Esq all the rest and residue of my estate not heretofore mentioned and disposed of I will and bequeath to my said Executor in trust for the use following he is to put out my said estate and land out all money that may come to his hands and such rents upon and profits shall once in every year be paid over to my daughter Susan D. Towles and her individual receipt for the same shall be as valid a receipt for him as though she were unmarried

of all such worldly estate as it has pleased God to bless me with
I give and bequeath the same in manner following, that is to say,
I desire first of all that my just debts and funeral expenses be

enough to supply the same during her natural life and at her

I give to my wife my horse wagon and gear, also my two horse
plow & two cow horse plows with the necessary rigging for use
also horse & axes, I give to my wife also the cattle claimed &

named negroes be retained on the place, until something to transpire
more permanent in relation to them, or they are freed

I desire also that the remainder of my lands be equally divided among my children above named.

I give and bequeath to my dear daughter Elizabeth a Cow & Calf (Cow named Polkantas

I give and begin with to my son George H. Cabell a yearling Cattle now on the place

I give and bequeath to my three daughters Mary F. Tracy, B. V. Virginia McNeill a three year old filly, natural pacer and a Canadian blood

All the rest and residue of my estate both real and personal of what
nature ^{or kind} soever, it may be well known before particularly disposed of, I
desire may be equally divided among my several children here and
before mentioned which I give to give to them, their heirs executors, and
