

In the name of God Amen. I John Melton of the County of Henderson and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory (for which I thank God) and Calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estates as it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give and bequeath the same in manner following to-wit:-
 1st After the payment of all my just debts of funeral expences I give my wife Elizabeth One third part of my Estate, both real & personal, for and during the term of her natural life, and after her decease I give the same to my Son Robert to him & his heirs forever. 2nd I give to my son Eli the fifty acres of Land on which he is at this time living; 3rd I give to my son Joseph One hundred acres of land to be run off so as to include the improvement where he now lives. 4th I give to William Melton and John Melton and George E. Melton and Franklin Melton (infant heirs of my son Daniel dec'd) the sum of One dollar each, and to their mother Mary Melton One dollar. 5th I bequeath to my son John B. Melton my share tract of Land. 6th I give to my daughter Darcas the sum of Twenty dollars. 7th I give to my two sons James Smith & William Richmond each fifty acres of land. 8th I give to my daughter Mary Elizabeth Twenty Dollars. 9th I give to my son Robert all the rest of my Estate, both real and personal of what nature or kind soever it may be, not herein before particularly disposed of to him & his heirs, executors, administrators & assigns forever. 10th And lastly I do hereby appoint my friend George F. Edwards & my son Robert executors of this my last Will & Testament hereby revoking all other or former wills or Testaments by me heretofore made.

Know all men by these presents that I William L. Lewis of the County of Henderson State of Kentucky being of sound mind and disposing memory, but of low health, do make and publish this as my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills -

Item 1st It is my first desire that all of my just debts shall be paid - Item 2nd My second wish is that all my Estate of whatever kind be sold, and the money arising from it be divided between my brother Edward M. Lewis and my sister Martha Ann Davis in the proportion of two thirds to the former and One third to the latter - I nominate and appoint my brother Edward M. Lewis my sole Executor to this

and devise to each of my children as they shall respectively come of lawful age or marry One hundred and fifty acres of land to be so laid off as not to interfere with the farm on which I now reside, and the different parts of my land being of unequal value, my Will and desire is, that when my Executor or either of them Causes the said hundred and fifty acres of land to be laid off for each or my child, they shall have the same valued by three disinterested men without reference to any improvement made on the land by the child to whom it may be allotted, and when the rest of my property shall be divided among my children, as herein after provided for, that my Executors or either of them shall advert to these Valuations of the land and make them equal out of my personal Estate. Fourth. All the rest of my Estate both real and personal (except the One hundred and fifty acres of land above devised to each of my children) I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Rebecca Boswell for and during her natural life, and at her death to be equally divided among my children after having equalized the Valuation of the lands distributed among them in the third clause of this my last will and Testament. Fifth. I hereby revoke and annul all or any other last will & Testament which may heretofore have been made. Sixth. I hereby Constitute and appoint my said wife Rebecca Boswell and my son John M. Boswell and the survivor of them Executors and executors of this my last Will and Testament, and invest them or the survivor of them with all the powers necessary to carry into full effect each and every clause hereof. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 27th day of November in the year 1834.
