In the Name of God Amen. I Ann G. Gill of the Town and County of Henderson & State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing Memory (revoking all former Wills made by me), do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament (that is to say)

It is my Will and desire that my Executor hereinafter named, shall after my death, sell and dispose of, upon such terms as he may think most advantageous for my estate (all the property both real and personal of which I may die possessed, or to which I may have right or title, Subject to the Conditions & exceptions hereinafter made).

It is my Will and desire that my house and lot situated in the Town of Henderson, State of Kentucky in which I now reside, remain unsold, and be occupied and used as a residence by my three daughters Mary E. Barnard, Eliza G. Gill and Maria Louisa Gill free of rent until my youngest daughter Maria Louisa Gill shall arrive at the age of twenty one years - then it is my wish and desire that my said Executor sell the said house & lot on such terms as he may think most advantageous for my estate - It is my Will and desire that all the money of my estate which may come to the hands of my Executor be by him put out on interest, and the interest arising therefrom be appropriated to the maintenance & education of my two youngest daughters Eliza G. Gill and Maria Louisa Gill, until the youngest shall reach twenty one years of age. I do give and bequeath my bed & bed clothes to my two daughters Eliza G. Gill & Maria Louisa Gill to be equally divided between them.

I do give and bequeath to Archibald Dixon of the County & Town of Henderson and State of Kentucky in Trust for my Daughter Mary E. Barnard a small musical Clock made by my husband Isaac Gill. And of the money arising from the sale of my said property, when the whole of it shall be sold by my Executor as aforesaid, I give and bequeath two fifths of the same to my two sons William G. Gill & Joseph G. Gill to be equally divided between them - but they are not to have the same until after the sale of my house & lot in the Town of Henderson - Upon my youngest

daughter Maria Louisa Gill reaching twenty one years of age: the interest of said money to that time to be appropriated to the support of my two youngest daughters as aforesaid. And the other three fifths I give and bequeath to Archibald Dixon of the Town and State aforesaid in Trust for the use and benefit of my three daughters Mary E. Barnard, Eliza G. Gill and Maria Louisa Gill (their interest in the same to be equal). It is further my will and desire that the said Archibald Dixon, whenever he shall think it best to do so shall divide equally between my three daughters (said Mary E. Barnard, Eliza G. Gill and Maria Louisa Gill the money arising from the sale of my said property which I have bequeathed to them as aforesaid and until he thinks it best to make such division. My wish is that he should loan the said money out, and appropriate the interest to their support. And if either of my said Daughters shall die without issue, it is my will that the money and property herein bequeathed to her, shall go to, and be equally divided between her surviving brothers and sisters or their children. I appoint Archibald Dixon executor of this my last will & Testament in witness of all which I have hereto set my hand and affixed my seal this 9th day of January 1839

1st I desire that my just debts and funeral expenses be paid.
2^d I give to my Daughter Harriet Alexander Two Hundred and Eighty Dollars
3^d I give to Elizabeth Trice Two Hundred and Eighty Dollars
4th I give to Wesley Parker Two Hundred and Eighty Dollars when he arrives at the age of twenty one years, and my will and desire is that said Wesley be at liberty to act and work for himself, when he arrives to Eighteen years of age - 5th I give and bequeath to my son George Parker Two Hundred and Eighty Dollars, when he arrives to the age of twenty one years, and that he be free to act and work for himself at Eighteen years of age - 6th I give and bequeath to my son Joel Parker Two Hundred and Eighty Dollars when he arrives to the age of twenty one years and that he act and work for himself when he arrives to the age of Eighteen years - 7th I give to my Daughter Mary Ann Parker Two Hundred and Eighty Dollars when she arrives to the age of twenty years, or if said Mary Ann marry before she arrives to the age of Twenty one years, if her mother is living, and thinks proper she may pay the said Mary the above said sum

84 I give to my Daughter Eliza Jane Parker Two Hundred and Eighty Dollars when she arrives at the age of twenty one years. And if said Eliza Jane marries before she arrives to the age of twenty one years and her mother is living and thinks proper she can pay said Eliza from the above named sum -

94 I give to my son John Parker Two Hundred and Eighty Dollars when he arrives to the age of twenty one years. And that he free to act and work for himself when he arrives to the age of eighteen years -

104 I give to my Daughter Martha Parker Two Hundred and Eighty Dollars, when she arrives to the age of twenty one years. And if she marries and her mother is living and thinks proper she can pay to the said Martha the above named sum -

11 I give and bequeath to my wife Ruthy Parker during her life or widowhood for her benefit all my estate personal and real, and if she marries my wish and desire is, that she have One thousand Dollars to dispose of as she thinks proper.

(And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend John Cappe my Executor to this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all others or former wills or Testaments heretofore by me made. September 5th 1839 -

I Samuel Hopkins being sick and weak in body but of sound mind, do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament in the manner and form following

1st I give and bequeath to my dear daughter Jane B. Price the one half of the tract of land on which she lives to be divided according to quantity and quality regardless of the value of the Improvements -

2nd I give to my dear daughter Lucy B. Key fifty Dollars provided there is a surplus -

3rd I give to my dear son Arthur the horse and mare which he now possesses together with the one half of the land which I have on, together with one half of all the balance of my estate after paying my just debts. If I give to my dear son William one half of the land which I have on, together with the two horses usually called his, with one half of all the balance of my estate after paying my just debts, provided however the said Arthur and William furnish a sufficient home for my wife during her natural life, but provided further that Arthur be allowed to live. 5th I give to my dear daughter Frances one half of the tract of land, which Mrs Price now lives on, together with my land in Hopkins County amounting to One Hundred and twenty five acres, beside what I have already given her.

I wish it to be expressly understood that all of my just debts are to be first paid. And lastly I appoint my dear son Arthur of Hopkins and William B. Hopkins the Executors to this my last will and Testament.
