I William B Jones of Henderson County Kentucky of sound mind and memory do make public and a last, this my last will and testament, that I give devise and bequeath all my estate and property real and personal, to my beloved wife Rebecca Jones, and yet however to a trust to say, One Dollar to each of my children by my first wife, to each of my married children by the said Rebecca and each of my unmarried children by the said Rebecca respecting my marriage arrived at the age of twenty one years

the property and estate aforesaid to vest absolutely in the said Rebecca and her heirs for me for ever, subject only as aforesaid and the said trust shall not affect her right for to dispose of said and transfer any such property, and I appoint my said wife Rebecca executrix of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twelfth day of February one thousand eight hundred and twenty two (1862)

at the request and in the presence of William B Jones (William B Jones) we among heretofore named as witnesses, signed, sealed and delivered in presence of the State of Kentucky and Henderson County

This day this paper purporting to be the last will and testament of W B Jones was produced in open court and being proved by the oath of the subscribing witnesses J. W. Ruttinger J. H. Walker J. H. Russell was ordered to be recorded which is here done

I have been of the same kind of matter and people that
in them all I am ^{entirely} attached to my above written will. Second 2^d my
February 1854 regarding such people as in the above mentioned
as to the provisions contained in this will I wish that August
Levy, be appointed and acted joint Guardian with A. Dubel of my
children Pauline Lewis and Eugene during their minority and I would
prefer that in lieu of their being educated and maintained in the
Protestant Episcopal Academy at Louisville, my said children reside
with the said August Perry (who is my Brother in Law) at
Louisville. If of he will willingly receive them into his house
I further I voluntarily desire as before expressed that they be
educated by a person or persons to be selected by such guardians
who are believers in the Protestant faith & I would prefer that
they be taught in the religious belief of the Protestant Episcopal
Church. But if my said children should at any time during
their residence with August Perry become dissatisfied and wish
to reside else where I wish in that event that A. Dubel select and
designate for them another place of residence and have them
educated, as expressed in my above written will.

In the event of the decease of either of said guardians or their refusal to act as guardians of my said children I desire the remaining guardian to act.

I further request that my Executors Peter Little Gibel and A
Lutzel do from time to time pay ^{over} out to the guardians of my
said children sum's sufficient for the proper education
or maintenance of my said children
