Grant Green I name as the executor of my will My wife Mary H. Barlow and Wm J. Marshall In testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand and signature this 20th August 1860

Elyse B. Allison being of sound mind and disposing memory but being also aware of the uncertainty of human life do constitute & appoint this my last Will and Testament, Revoking all other wills deeds and instruments of writing professed to have been made by me as I should all such as forgery and utterly held for naught

I give and bequeath to Col Wm P. Grayson & Susan Grayson his wife the whole of my landed estate in the County of Harrison and State of Kentucky situated on the N. Orleans & Ohio Rail Road embracing seven hundred Acres in the Highlands tract. Also a plot of 16 hundred and forty six Acres my home tract one mile from the said road

This property is a free simple gift inexpressive of my gratitude for affection and kindness extended by Col Grayson his excellent wife & daughter all I give to Col Wm P. Grayson 320 Acres of land during his life & should he die to revert to his wife & to the heirs of his body to have & hold forever I give and bequeath to Susan Grayson the residue of my estate for the support & use of herself and her children to be managed and disposed of by her as she thinks best for the promotion of herself and her children that the power absolutely is invested in her to sell or do as she chooses

I also desire that a double memorandum be cast over and sent over the graves of my husband & myself the same reading to be preserved at all times the marble slab which an altar on hand at that place. My debt of any shall be paid but I know of none and there are none except goods on I have a number of Bedstead & many other articles of born in the care of Richard Buchanan at Springfield. I desire that the likeness of my husband also a portrait of me containing his head shall be preserved in the Grayson family When made I set my hand and affix my seal this 7th day of July 1862

I give also my Black Stock in the Farmers Bank during her natural life. I will to Sarah Ann Annals a negro woman Polly & Eliza & Mary a girl about 10 years old & a horse bridle & saddle and but I desire on my death I will also to Sarah Ann Annals the interest of 1000 dollars annually I also will to my wife all the Estate of her Mother down in her father's estate to give grant to whom she pleases & to whom she pleases or to do with it as she may wish & at my wife's death for Sarah Ann Annals to have & enjoy all the above named land and negroes household furniture during her natural life & if she dies without a bodily heir or heirs then for it to go to my other lawful heirs the remainder of my cash & cash not named above I will to the following heirs to wit: Stephen Annals One hundred dollars John B. Annals One hundred dollars Elizabeth Annals One hundred dollars the I desire

One hundred dollar George H. Amett One hundred dollar my sister Elizabeth Norman heir One hundred dollar to be divided amongst them Also Samuel Proyer heir One hundred dollar to be divided amongst them Also Legun Amett One hundred dollar & Legun Norman One hundred dollar I also leave my wife Martha P.  - It is my wish that the above named lots of negroes be valued so that they each get equal portions in Valuation
 - I leave to my four grand children namely George C. Mathias Sarah Jane Mathias Laura Mathias and Elizabeth Mathias the following negroes to them and the heirs of their bodies forever namely, One negro man John Lydon and little Sam and Silas future increase
 - It is my wish that my said grand children be made equal with my other three children. And if there is not money and bonds enough to make them equal, that the negroes be kept until a sufficient be raised
 - It is my wish that my old woman Polly be allowed the liberty of living with either of my children till she may think proper yet not to be considered free
 - I give to my grand daughter Elizabeth Sanford Mathias Five hundred dollars in addition to her interest above set forth
 - It is also my wish that out of the persons selected to value the three first lots of negroes be chosen by my Executor and the three first

mentioned lay two and each

I appoint J. H. Brown my executor to carry into effect by my will

 - I give to my son Fayette Jones my negro man slave named George to him & his heirs forever
 - I desire that all my Room furniture be equally divided between my three grand daughters Nellie Lizzie & Mary commonly called Minnie & daughters of my son Abram & Fayette except my best and best land which with all necessary clothing is to go to Lizzie Jones my third Wife to my grand son Frederick A. Jones
 - I hereby appoint my son Abram Jones for all his children to receive the portion of my estate hereon to them and he is to hold possession and have the use of them his life time and shall not be accountable for him
 - I hereby appoint my son Abram Jones Executor of this my last will and Testament
