I Reuben Mopf of the County of Henderson and State of Kentucky be of sound mind and disposing memory feeling the uncertainty of human life and the certainty of Death make this my last will and testament in words and figures following Item 1st It is my last will and desire that after Death my body shall be buried in a plain unostentatious and Christian manner committing my spirit to the tender mercies of the God who gave it Item 2nd It is my will and desire that all just debts which I may be owing at the time of my Death be paid by my Executor out of any fund belonging to me I desire and it is desired should be none or not enough then that so much of my personal estate as may be necessary be sold for that purpose Item 3rd It is my will and desire that by these presents I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Matilda Mopf all of my estate of whatever Description whether real personal or mixed for the term of her natural life with full power to dispose thereof or any part thereof that she may deem best to secure her a comfortable maintenance should the rent and profits thereof be insufficient for that purpose Item 4th It is my will and desire that after the death of my said wife Matilda Mopf all my said estate of whatever description whether real personal or mixed shall belong to my daughter in law Lucy Jane Mopf the wife of my son John R.
