Hicks shall be paid for his trouble for travelling and collecting my legacy in Harrow County this State and for my board as long as I may stay his house and that all other just debts be paid Item 2^d I will and bequeath that my bed and bedding and all other movable property shall be given to my two grand-daughters Sarah Anna Wilson & Harriett Lee Wilson and that one third of the balance of my Estate shall be equally divided between the two above named girls and that R. L. Hicks shall retain their legacy until they become of age. Item 3^d I will and bequeath that one third of my Estate shall be given to my daughter Katharine M. Longhine during her life and then to the balance of her children - Item 4^d I will and bequeath to my son Samuel H. Lewis one half of the balance remaining third of my Estate. Item 5^d I will and bequeath to my grand-daughter Lucy Anna Lewis the remainder of my Estate being one half third I do hereby constitute and appoint Benjamin L. Hicks trustee for Lucy Anna Lewis to keep the above named legacy until she marries or arrives at the age of twenty one years. And that this my last will and Testament may be carried into full and complete effect. I do hereby constitute and appoint Benjamin L. Hicks and R. M. McFarland my Executors of this my will. Will

Domine

In the Name of God Amen. I Charles N. Blay of the County of Henderson & State of Kentucky being sound in mind, and knowing that all men must die. I do hereby ordain and establish this as my last Will and Testament of all things that I of right have to dispose of as follows to-wit: In the first place I will all my just debts to be paid - Second. I will and bequeath to my wife Amelia N. Blay the tract of land on which I now live with all its appurtenances appertaining thereto. All my stock of every description including Horses, Cattle, Sheep &c. I also will and bequeath to my wife, four of my negroes (such four as she may select of my negroes at my death). Thirdly. I will and bequeath to my daughter Mary Ann Dixon One Negro woman Nira which she has in her possession and One Horse & saddle, Bed & furniture which is also in her possession. I give it to her and her heirs forever - Fourthly. I will and bequeath to my daughter Isabelle P. Dixon One Horse & saddle, Bed & furniture, and having also given her One Hundred twenty five Acres of land to her & her heirs forever. Fifthly. I will and bequeath to my daughter Henrietta P. Ball my Negro girl & Pallas, one Horse, Bridle & saddle, Bed & furniture to her and her heirs forever. Sixthly. I will and bequeath to my son Daughter Mary Ann Dixon, Henrietta P. Ball and Isabelle P. Dixon the balance of my Negro property to them and the heirs of their body to be equally divided without sale if possible if not, to be sold and the net proceeds equally divided between them. Lastly, I will my soul to God & my body to do no other will. In Testimony that I have made the foregoing Will as my last
