I, Julius S Johnson of the city and County of Henderson and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory, commending my soul to god with glad heart, and resigning myself to earth from whence it came. Knowing this uncertainly of life and being desirous of disposing of my earthly effects do make public and publish this my last Will and Testament.

1st I desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid and I desire my executor hereinafter named to sell and convert into money any and all of my property both real and personal, and with that and any other money that I may to hand and due me to purchase a residence in the city of Henderson, such as his duties will meet the requirements hereinafter made.

2nd I desire and direct my executor hereinafter named, the surplus of his selling for the said Residence to be used in repairing same, and the balance to be paid out at interest.

3rd I will and bequeath to my daughter Belle S. Rice the said Residence and all the money thereon, during her widowhood and during her natural life if she does not marry.

4th I give my daughter Belle S. Rice should marry, then at her death, I will and bequeath the said residence and money if any be the heirs of my body equally between them, if living and if dead then each child's part to go to his or her children.

5th Having full confidence in the capacity and integrity of my son W. S. Johnson, I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint him sole executor with full power and authority to carry the provisions of this Will. And my executor hereinafter named may at any time he thinks proper by and with the consent of my daughter Belle S. Rice during her widowhood sell and convey the said Residence and the interest in the money from said sale or the undivided shall be for the benefit of my daughter Belle S. Rice as hereinafter provided.

1st I will that my executor hereinafter named, dispose for sale my personal property and that as much of the proceeds as may be necessary be applied to the payment of my debts.

2nd I will that the real estate together with the household furniture which is not in any case to be sold, and the remainder of the proceeds arising from said sale remain in the hands of my wife Mary.

3rd I will that my wife Mary and I should during my natural life for her support and support, and if the income arising therefrom be not sufficient for her support and support, she is empowered to sell or part or all of the estate provided she can sell the real estate for the sum of eight (\$8) thousands of dollars.

4th I will that after the sale of said real estate my wife Mary is to have the right to live on said property as she may think fit and proper after advising with my son Hamilton.

5th After the death of my wife Mary I will that the estate be divided into 3 equal parts, and that my two oldest sons J. S. Williams receive jointly one part, my son Hamilton one part, and my daughter Margaret one part.

6th The two oldest having received enough to make them equal to the latter or equal to me third of my present estate.

7th I will that my son Hamilton be my wife's advisor during her life, and her executor after her death.
