I Henry J. Easton do make and publish, this my last Will and Testament as follows: (Whereas I am bound to Thos. Lambert in several notes, for the purchase of the Mill property at Spottsville Henderson County Ky. upon which my sister Mrs. Eliza Jones, is bound as my surety - and whereas I desire to secure her as such my surety in said notes, as well as a note to Mrs. Thornton of Henderson County for negro hire, she my sister being my surety in said note, I do will and devise, that my said sister Eliza Jones, do have, and I do hereby give and bequeath, unto her all my real Estate in the State of Texas of all kinds and descriptions with full power to see the same on such terms as she may deem advisable, and out of the proceeds thereof, to reimburse herself should she have the debts aforesaid or any part thereof to pay, and after she shall have been reimbursed, I desire, that my Estate be divided into two equal parts, One half of which shall go to my sister Mrs. Eliza Jones, and the other half to my sister Mary, and her daughter Mary & Henrietta after her death, should I in the above bequest have omitted any debts which I may owe for which either of my said sisters are my surety, I desire that they shall be made secure and reimbursed for any amount they may have to pay before the division contemplated by this my last Will and Testament takes place - I hereby appoint my said sister Eliza Jones my Exor. with full power to sell to accomplish the purposes aforesaid, I desire that all my Estate, real, personal and mixed, shall be divided and vest in my said sisters and heirs in the same way and subject to the same charges as set forth in relation to said lands of oreanum given under my hand this 29th March 1858.

Item 2^d The balance of my property and effects not above written, I will & give to my sister Jane. Item 3^d I hereby nominate my friend J. P. Whitcomb shall have five Dollars of my estate for the love and respect I have for him also desire that Perry F. Whitcomb shall have five dollars of my estate for the love and respect I have for him. I also desire that the rest of my property shall be divided equally between my daughters named as follows Sarah, Julia, & Anna. I desire that they shall have 15 Dollars each. I desire that I wish at my death that all my Property shall be equally divided equally among my daughters at my death. I do this day appoint R. A. Sugg my lawful executor from this day July 30th 1858 to attend and take care of my property from this day hence bind myself to not trade said property without R. A. Sugg's consent. I also desire that my son R. A. Sugg shall from this day take charge of all my business consisting of one Negro man named Peter also all of my personal property consisting of Hogs, cattle and horses also my money. I desire that R. A. Sugg shall take care of me during my life time.

In the name of God amen I John Pitcheall of the County of
Henderson and State of Kentucky knowing the uncertainty of life and the
certainty of death and being of sound mind and disposing memory do
make and publish this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking
and making void all former Wills by me at any time heretofore made as to
such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to entrust me with. I dispose
of the same as follows First I give and devise to my beloved wife
Sarah Pitcheall Two Hundred acres of land including my mansion house
in lot of acres together with all and singular the appurtenances thereto
thereunto belonging or in any way appertaining unto her the said Sarah
Pitcheall during her natural life. I also give and bequeath to my beloved
wife the following Slaves called and known by the following names
to wit: Sam (about thirty four years of age) Nathan (about twenty seven
years of age) Ann a Negro Woman (about twenty three years of age) said
Slaves to be held by her during her natural life. My pleasure Carriage and
two Carriage Horses (to be retained by her out of my stock of Horses) Two
Kilch Cows and ten head of Hogs (to be likewise retained by herself out of my
stock of Cattle and Hogs) Two Pews and two chairs of gleaming and such
articles of household and kitchen furniture as she may want and at
provision for one year support from the date of my death. Provided
that the said Sarah Pitcheall (my wife) shall remain my widow and
if she marry again then it is my will that she shall retain but one
Negro Slave to wit the Negro Woman above named.
I also give and bequeath to my little grand daughter Sarah Pitcheall
the daughter of my deceased son Wellington Pitcheall Five Hundred
dollars.
I also to my son James H. Pitcheall I will and bequeath One hundred
and fifty Eight acres of Land off the survey which I purchased
of Harbert Swell son said land joins the tract of land in which
James H. Brown now July 1858 resides and includes the mansion in
which said James H. Pitcheall now resides (July 1858)

4th To my son Persley Pitcheall I give and bequeath twenty acres off the west
side of a tract of land which I purchased of Edward Williams of the State of
Virginia said twenty acres to include the improvements made by said Persley Pitcheall
5th To my daughter Nancy Williams I give and bequeath twenty acres off the
the tract of land which I purchased of Edward Williams of the State of Virginia
lying and running parallel with and adjoining the lot of land which I have
bequeathed to my son Persley Pitcheall.
6th To my daughter Sarah Ann Swell I give and bequeath twenty acres off the
tract of land which I purchased of Edward Williams of the State of Virginia
lying and running parallel with and adjoining the lot of land which I
have bequeathed to my daughter Nancy Williams.
7th To my son Lewis H. Pitcheall I give and bequeath forty four acres off
the lot of land which I purchased from the estate of Col James Powell 1850
said forty four acres to include the mansion in which said Lewis H. Pitcheall
now (July 1858) resides I also give and bequeath to said Lewis H. Pitcheall
fifty six acres which was patented in the name of Berry said
fifty six acres to lie adjoining the aforesaid forty four acres.
8th To my son George H. Pitcheall I give and bequeath One Hundred
acres off the tract of land which I purchased of Harbert Swell son
said one Hundred acres to lie adjoining the lot which I have bequeathed
to my son James H. Pitcheall and to include the mansion in which
said George H. Pitcheall now (July 1858) resides.
9th To my son John Pitcheall I give and bequeath One Hundred acres off
the tract of land which I purchased of Harbert Swell son said one
hundred acres to adjoin the lot of land which I have bequeathed to my son
George H. Pitcheall.
10th To my daughter Eliza M. Pitcheall I give and bequeath the remainder
of the tract of land which I purchased of Harbert Swell it being fifty
seven acres more or less and also a tract of one hundred acres more
or less South East of and adjoining to the above named fifty seven acres
on which there is at present a Saw Mill.
11th To my son Thomas A. H. Pitcheall I give and bequeath three
hundred acres of land including my mansion house together with
all and singular the appurtenances thereto belong it being the same
land which I have bequeathed to my wife Sarah Pitcheall. The said
Thomas A. H. Pitcheall or his guardian if he be a minor to have full
possession and control over the said three Hundred acres of land
aforesaid at the death of my wife Sarah Pitcheall but not before.
For the laying off of the aforesaid three Hundred acres of land it is
my will and desire that it be laid off so as to include all of my house
tract. The balance of the Berry tract not otherwise disposed of and
so much of the tract which I purchased of Edward Williams as it
is necessary to make three Hundred acres.
12th To my son Lazarus H. Pitcheall I give and bequeath One
thousand Dollars.
And 13th And lastly as to all the rest residue and remainder
my estate both personal and real goods and chattels of what kind
and nature soever my will and desire is that the said money and
property be equally divided among my children whose names are
