

Below Webster County Ky April 26th 1870

This my last Will and Testament made for the benefit of my wife Rosa Clark & my children who are under the age of eighteen years at my death. I bequeath to my wife Rosa Clark & children in due the age of eighteen years my entire personal estate and the contents of my Confectionary Shop in the City of Henderson, Henderson County Ky now occupied by J. H. Stephens, the said real estate & Confectionary shop to be at my wife Rosa Clark's disposal to sell & reinvest in other property for the benefit of herself and my infant children. Provided that at the death or marriage of my said wife then my Executors shall take possession of the said property bequeathed to my said wife & children to be used by said Executor for the maintenance schooling &c. of my children until the youngest reaches the age of eighteen years, then it is my wish that all my property both personal & real estate shall be equally divided between all my children. Provided should any of my children become crippled or in any other way become afflicted so they cannot make a support for themselves, then I bequeath to such one two shares of my estate. And I further provide that my son John Clark shall be Executor of this my last Will & Testament & in his my request that the County Court will not require any security of my son John Clark as my Executor. I further provide that my son John Clark shall ask as Executor for my wife Rosa Clark, with Power to sell any or all of my personal estate & to reinvest the proceeds in other property by my wife's consent.

May County Court 1875 (24th day of May 1875)
The foregoing Will of Wm. H. Clark late of Henderson Co dec^d was proved according to law by the testimony of James H. Pritch one of the subscribing witnesses thereto who being first duly sworn stated that said Will was written by him at and as directed by the Testator Clark, who signed and acknowledged it in the presence of said witness Pritch as his last Will and Testament, and that witness Pritch and Michael O'Gorman signed said Will at request of said Clark and in his presence and in the presence of each other, that said Clark was at the time of signing and publishing said Will of sound mind and disposing memory, and the following order was afterwards made and entered of record: "It appearing that Michael O'Gorman one of the subscribing witnesses to the last Will and Testament of Wm. H. Clark dec^d is absent from the state and cannot be found and the Will having been heretofore proved by the testimony of James H. Pritch one of the subscribing witnesses thereto, it is adjudged that the same is the true last Will and Testament of said Wm. H. Clark dec^d and ordered to be recorded as such." Thereupon

In the name of God Amen! I Isaac W. Handley of the County of Henderson & State of Kentucky, being of sound mind & disposing memory prais'd be to God for the same & being desirous of settling my worldly affairs while I have strength & capacity so to do, do make & publish this my last Will & Testament that is to say, 1st I will give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary A. Handley, the portion of land I now live on beginning at a locust tree corner to the Shos A. Sandifer land & running on a straight line to an elm tree near the shop & thence on a straight line to the road at the corner of a small meadow on said road, and on the line between me & the land of D. W. Baldwin's dec^d & thence with said line to a locust tree corner to the W. Proctor & thence with the road & his line to the farm of Dr. J. M. Powell thence with his line & the line of R. W. Powell to the land of Shos A. Sandifer & thence with said land to the beginning, during her natural life & said land at her death is to my son John P. Handley & Lucinda Rabb sister of my wife Mary A. Handley, is to be supported off the proceeds of said land until to my wife during her natural life & I hereby appoint John P. Handley & Shos A. Sandifer to rent, lease, cultivate said land & see that my wife & Lucinda Rabb are supported out of the proceeds of said land, 2^d To my nephew Shos A. Sandifer I give will and bequeath to him one red heifer calf of one black milky cow & three out of one of two colts which I at this time own, and one half interest in one black Jack, & one half interest in one bay mare called Nitty Smelter, when he shall have paid to the administering tor of Shos A. Sandifer dec^d one half of a note or notes to him & assigned by me to him & one half of Twenty three \$ Dollars due from Shos A. Sandifer the purchase money of said Jack, 3^d and last, After the payment of all my just debts & burial expenses, I will give & bequeath to my son John P. Handley all the rest, residue & remainders of my estate, both personal & real consisting of the remainder of my landed estate and all of my personal effects of whatever kind I may be possessed to him his heirs or assigns including the portion of land willed to my wife at her death and I do hereby appoint, 1st my son John P. Handley & 2^d Shos A. Sandifer as my sole Executors without bond or security of my estate and I warrant them to cultivate the farm this year & pay off all my debtors of the proceeds of sd crop, In witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this the 1st day of February 1875,
