In the Name of God Amen. I Griffin Braddock of the County of Henderson and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind & disposing memory, do make & ordain this my last will & testament revoking all others heretofore made in the following, to wit: I lend to my beloved wife Elizabeth Braddock all of my Estate both money & personal during her natural life, or until she marries, & in Case she marries, then in that Case my wills desire is that my Estate be divided into three equal parts, & my son Jesse Braddock is to have two parts, or in other words two thirds & my wife Elizabeth Braddock is to have one third of my Estate to have and to hold during her natural life, and at her death it is my wish that that portion assigned to my wife is to fall to my son Jesse Braddock.

It is further my wish that my wife Elizabeth Braddock shall have the right to dispose of all my Estate if my son Jesse Braddock should die before he becomes of age, and in Case he my son Jesse Braddock lives to arrive at the age of twenty one years, and in that Case if he my son Jesse Braddock should be the longest liver, he is to have the right to dispose of all the property of which I am proprietor of. But if my wife should be the longest liver notwithstanding my son Jesse Braddock should be of age at the time of his death it is my wish that the my beloved wife should have the disposing of my Estate. It is further my wish that my son Jesse Braddock should be educated out of my Estate at the discretion of his mother. Lastly I nominate and appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth Braddock sole executrix to this my last will & testament, and it is my wish for her not to be bound to give security as executrix. Lastly I acknowledge this to be my last will and testament. In Testimony Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 12th day of December 1836

Will

I Will J. Marshall of the County of Henderson and State of Ky being of sound mind and memory, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament. I bequeath all my property both real mixed and personal to my wife Sarah during her widow hood for the purpose of supporting raising and educating our children, should she marry she will receive only a Childs part; As the children become of age she will give them such a share of my Estate as they would have been entitled to had made no will, I wish my Executor and I do hereby empower him (Should my wife Sarah wish it) to sell the whole or any parts of my land and negroes, the proceeds of which to be loaned on farming security for the support of my wife and children, the interest of trust and believe will be sufficient for this proper support and maintenance. Therefore request that the principal of the notes may remain untouched. My Wishes I bequeath to Jm. G. Holloway and appoint him my sole executor requesting that he may be permitted to qualify without giving security relying upon his integrity for carrying out my wishes as expressed above into full and complete effect.
