Item 2nd I will Fifty dollars to be expended in erecting tomb stones on my grave
I also will one hundred dollars to Dr Henry H. Farmer to be held
by him and paid by him as needed to keep our family grave yards in repair
& cleaned off as long as it (the firm) may last.
Item 3rd All the balance of my property & effects of every kind & description
including land and negro (if any) to be sold & the one half of the
proceeds of said sale together with the one half of what money & notes I may

have, I will give to my grand daughter Henrietta Vaughan the one fourth of the same
I will give to Dr Henry H. Farmer the remaining fourth of the same I will give to
William Hatchette & son of Jas S. Hatchette.

Item 4th I do not wish my land sold until it will bring the sum of Twenty dollars per
acre and it rented out until then being the price and the proceeds to be divided in
the above proportion between the above named Henrietta Vaughan Dr H. H. Farmer & Hatchette
Item 5th I hereby make all former Wills made by me and nominate and
appoint J. S. Hatchette & Dr H. H. Farmer Executors of the my last Will & Testament

It is my wish and desire that my son James A. Hatchett act as executor of my last Will & I humbly pray that the Court may not require him to give any security. I also will and grant to him full and discretionary power to manage the estate in such manner as he may deem most conducive to the interests of the legation. And do not wish him to be responsible for any error or mistake which he may commit in his execution thereof as I am aware it will be attended with much trouble and difficulty particularly in settling a debt which has been or probably will be brought against me as administrator of James A. Brown dec. and in getting possession of certain property coming to me from the State of Virginia.

Not having full confidence in the judgment & integrity of my executor J. A. Hatchett I have thought it best to grant him full power as I hereby do to compromise either of the above cases or any other which may arise or settle them in any manner he may think best & desire & pray that he may be held harmless in so doing. At the final division of my estate the four old negro Sam. Sabra Jim & Kelly should say to him living. I wish to have the privilege of choosing their owners who shall be allowed to take them at Valued in.
