6 I give and bequeath to my nephew Nathan Wright, forty acres of the tract of land on which my late Wright lives, there is 180 acres, in the whole tract and this forty acres are to be taken off the lower end of the tract to him his heirs or assigns forever

7 All the rest and residue of my estate not herein before mentioned and disposed of, I give, the less acre lot on which I live (except the part bequeathed to my wife) the less lot fronting on Main Street on which Mrs. Mary Miller lives the other near and adjoining the lot on Water Street near Eliza Brandt the lot fronting on Mill Street between Reithard Brick Store and Jacob Hulse Tavern, my lot of land containing about 200 acres of farm on it lying about three miles north east of the City of Henderson, two lots lying in the City of Evansville, my tract of land lying in Vanderburgh County Indiana known Township containing seventy acres, and all my claims, not here and before disposed of and all money (except the five before given to my wife) and all attachable debts that may be in hand or owing at the time of my death, are all to come to the hands of my executor herein after named, and shall be by him loaned, sold, paid out from year to year and the rents, issues, and profits arising therefrom to constitute in his hands, with which to pay the taxes on the property mentioned in this will, as well that will be to my wife and daughter (if they fail or neglect to pay the same) as that coming directly to the hands of said executor. If it shall ever become necessary to sell any portion of said property, then my will and desire is that my said executor sell off the four or eastern end of my ten acre lot, that he sell alternate lots of fifty feet front, running back 200 feet to an alley full wide

8 It is further my will and desire that my executor hereinafter named advance due proportions of my estate that may be in his hands to my Grand Children as they arrive at full age or get married, having due regard to the raising & educating the young children of the said Elizabeth Feltwell

It is particularly my will and desire that at the death of my said wife and daughter Mrs. Feltwell, all the real estate mentioned herein and elsewhere and the claims then living, and what money and other property may be on hand, shall be equally divided between the children of the said Elizabeth Feltwell then living & descendants, of such as may be dead, if any, having due regard to such advancements as may have been made.
