

Mr. Holloway The last will and testament of William S. Holloway of Henderson
 Will County, Kentucky, made this 20th day of November 1863

No 1 I direct that my property, real and personal go to my executors hereinafter named in fee simple, but this devise is charged with the following trust and conditions viz: That said property and estate is for the benefit and use of my wife and all my children share & share alike, my wife taking & bearing as though she was one of the children.

No 2 I wish and direct that my said executors shall keep and use said property & estate without selling or alienating the same if they can do so, for the benefit of my said wife and children until my youngest child Fillmore, shall arrive at the age of 18 years. During which time the use and profits of said property & estate is to be applied to the support, maintenance & education of my unmarried children, and the support & maintenance of my said wife.

No 3 My executors are hereby authorized and directed to sell all and any part of said property, real or personal & make conveyances therefor and said conveyances & sales shall be good in any & every event.

No 4 If sales should be made as authorized in clause No 3 then the proceeds are to be kept and used for the purposes and as directed in clause No 3.

No 5 If my child Fillmore should die before arriving at 18 years of age I do not wish the division of my property as hereinafter in the next clause mentioned to be either delayed or retarded on that account, so soon as my youngest living child arrives at 18 years of age I wish the division to take place.

No 6 When Fillmore or my youngest living child (whichever it is) arrives at 18 years of age, I wish my property and estate, or what may be left of it and its proceeds, after satisfying my debts & funeral expenses, and after the support, maintenance & education mentioned in clause No 2, shall be then & there divided equally between all my children and my wife (she taking a child's part) share and share alike. If any of my children should die before that time, leaving a child or children, then such child or children are to take the share of their deceased parent.

No 7 I appoint and constitute my son James S. Holloway & my son in law J. Thompson executors of this my last will and testament I request and direct that no surety be required of them as such. Witness my hand and seal the day and date above mentioned.

1st I give and bequeath unto Wm. Wallace Thompson, James Thompson, and Ephraim Thompson, and Mary Jane Thompson, children of Wm. Thompson dec'd, and my dear, beloved grand children, the sum of one Hundred (\$100) Dollars each.

2nd I give and bequeath unto my two grand children, Louisa C. Thompson and Mary Jane Thompson, daughters of Wm. Thompson dec'd the sum of Five Hundred (\$500) Dollars each to be paid them by my executor herein after named, either on attaining the age of majority, or on their marriage.

3rd I give and bequeath to Wm. Thompson, Robert Thompson, Thomas Thompson and Jesse Thompson, sons and daughter of Thomas Thompson dec'd and my dear, beloved grand children, the sum of Two Thousand dollars, which amount is to be invested by my executor hereinafter named, in a fund for said children, and on the arrival of the youngest of said children at the age of majority, said fund or the proceeds thereof is to be equally divided between the said children.

4th I give and bequeath to my dear, beloved daughter Mildred Thompson, (now) wife of W. H. Thompson the sum of Two Thousand dollars to be paid and enjoyed by her as she wills.

5th The amounts herein before given and bequeathed are to be in full of the interest of the respective parties named in my estate.

6th I give and bequeath to my dear, beloved wife, Jane Thompson all the net and residue of my estate whatever to be used and enjoyed by her during her natural life, and at her death whatever shall remain shall be equally divided share and share alike, between my following dear, beloved children, to wit: Harvey Davis, of Williamson County, Illinois; James Thompson, Jackson County, Illinois; Mrs. Elizabeth Lee, Princeton, Caldwell Co. Kentucky, and J. Thompson of the County of Henderson and State of Kentucky, and said interest is to be in full of any interest they may have in my estate.

7th I hereby constitute and appoint my dear, beloved son Mackey Thompson of the County of Henderson and State of Kentucky, the executor of this my last will and testament, who shall be permitted to qualify as my said executor without the execution of any bond.

It is my will and desire that my said executor shall invest the two thousand dollars mentioned in the third paragraph of this my last will and testament, in a suitable house for the children therein named, and he may at his discretion, and he is hereby authorized as to do, in the event the house purchased by him should prove unsuitable, or for any other cause sell the same, the proceeds thereof to be again invested as contemplated by said third paragraph.

It is my will and desire that my said wife Jane Thompson shall consult and advise with my executor in all things pertaining to the management of her part of my estate.
