I Alexander Blair Esquire, Advocate, Sheriff of Stirling, Dunbarton and Clackmannan consider my that the late Hugh Kerr, sometime Tobacco Merchant in Kentucky, United States of America, sometime residing in Liverpool, and thereafter residing in Edinburgh died in Edinburgh upon seventh February, Eighteen Hundred and Ninety one and that by his Last Will and Testament dated second December Eighteen

Hundred and eighty nine which is recorded in Court Books of the Commissariat of Dunbarton upon twenty sixth May, Eighteen Hundred and Ninety One - he said Hugh Kerr nominated and appointed John Anderson Tobacco Merchant residing in Caversham Kentucky, afterwards, presently residing at Saint Andrews; Hugh Kerr Waddell Commission Merchant Liverpool England and Walter Williamson Solicitor in Perth Ayrshire or the acceptor or acceptor survivor or survivor of them, them to be his Executors, and that the said John Anderson - Hugh Kerr Waddell and Walter Williamson have given up on oath an inventory of the personal estate and effects of the said Hugh Kerr at the time of his death including the proceeds accrued thereon to date of oath situated in Scotland and England amounting in value to Four Hundred and two thousand and twenty nine pounds, sixteen shillings and five pence Sterling which inventory as before written has likewise been recorded in the said Court Books of date twenty sixth May, Eighteen Hundred and Ninety one. Therefore I in Her Majesty's name and authority do hereby approve and confirm the nomination of Executors contained in the foregoing Last disposition and settlement and I give and commit to the said John Anderson - Hugh Kerr Waddell and Walter Williamson and the survivors or survivor of them full power to uplift receive, administer and dispose of the said Personal Estate and effects, grant discharges thereof if lawful, to pursue therefore, and generally, every other thing concerning the same to do that to the office of an Executor nominated is known to belong. Providing always that they shall render just account and reckoning for their administration thereof, where and where the same shall be legally required.
