6th I will and devise that the remaining six shares shall be given one each to my children Aaron Shelby Hicks, Lucy I White, Arthur I Hicks, Judith A Hegley, Samuel A Hicks and Benjamin Marguerite Hicks

7th I will and desire that my real estate shall be divided into seven equal shares one share of which I will and

bequeath to my son Aaron Shelby Hicks and Samuel A Hicks in trust for the children of my daughter Sarah E Kasey

8th I will and bequeath one share of my real estate to each of my sons Aaron Shelby Hicks, Arthur I Hicks and Samuel A Hicks

9th I will and bequeath the remaining three shares of my real estate to my three daughters and their children as follows One share to Lucy I White and her children one share to Judith A Hegley and her children and one share to Benjamin Marguerite Hicks and her children
