I Andrew Siddle of Vanderburgh County Indiana, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament. Item 1st I bequeath and devise to my daughter Willard Jane Rogers, and her heirs and assigns forever, the north half of my quarter section of land in Union Township of said County of Vanderburgh, said quarter Section being in section Number twenty six (26) in Township N^o Seven (7) South of Range N^o Eleven (11) West. And I bequeath and devise to my daughter Amanda W. Siddle and her heirs and assigns forever, the north half of the quarter Section above described. Item 2nd I bequeath and devise to my daughter Mary Willard Johnson, and to her heirs and assigns forever, my farm upon which I am now living containing one hundred and twenty three acres, being part of fractional Section N^o (25) twenty five in Township N^o Seven (7) South of Range N^o Eleven (11) West, purchased by one of H. H. Allid wife and Lewis Hovey wife, by deed bearing date Nov. 18th 1856. Item 3rd I bequeath and devise to my son Andrew J. Siddle and his heirs and assigns forever, my farm in Henderson County Kentucky, containing, one hundred and sixty six acres, the same being part of lot N^o 57 and which was purchased by me of David R. Durbank by deed bearing date 7 March 1st A.D. 1849 and recorded in Henderson County Ky in deed record book 2 page 321 to which reference is here made for a more particular description. Item 4th I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Elizabeth Swab the sum of Five Dollars to buy said her out of my personal effects. I give and bequeath to my four children Amanda W. Siddle, Marilla Jane Rogers Mary Willard Johnson and Andrew J. Siddle all my personal property, goods and effects in e, val parts after all my just

debt shall have been paid, should there be any over or left. Item 5th, I nominate and appoint Alexander Maddox & Joseph D. Parrell Executors to execute this my last Will and Testament. Item 7th I do hereby revoke all former wills by me made. In Testimony hereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this eight day of December A.D. 1862

Hardin & John W. Callatt in the presence of the said Testator, and in the presence of each other as subscribing witnesses thereto, and that the said Andrew Siddle was at the time of the signing, and subscribing of the said instrument in writing as aforesaid of full age (that is more than twenty one year of age) and of sound and disposing mind and memory, and not under any coercion or restraint, as the said deponent truly believes, and further deponent says not.
