(5)

Any property remaining on hand at the death of my wife shall be for the equal benefit of our said children to be owned by them share and share alike. (6) My wife shall have full authority to continue my grocery business at the present stand and shall have entire control and discretion in the management thereof she shall not be answerable to our children in any way as to the profits or losses resulting therefrom or from the control and management of any of my other property, having the fullest confidence in her judgment and integrity I feel assured that she will act for the best interest of all concerned.
