Will of Barbara Anthony

I am the name of Ned Arment.

I Barbara Anthony, being of sound mind and disposing memory do hereby make and constitute this my last will and testament.

1st After paying all funeral expense and necessary charges attending the settlement of my estate.

I will and bequeath to my three sisters, Laura, Martha and Margaret Daughton each one hundred dollars.

2d I will and bequeath to Sue A. Hodge daughter of my sister Elizabeth, three thousand dollars.

3d I will and bequeath to Antonio McQuinn Stone one thousand dollars.

4th I will and bequeath to Mary Bell Pennington for her sole use benefit & maintenance and the maintenance of her children one thousand dollars.

5th I will and bequeath to my sister Sue McQuinn all my wearing apparel, books, pictures and household goods.

6th I bequeath to the Trustees of the Third Street Presbyterian Church in the City of Cincinnati Kentucky in connection with the Northern General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church to which Church I was a member while a resident of the City of Cincinnati the sum of five hundred dollars. This sum to be paid by my Executors to the Treasurer of the Church and to be used in such manner and for such purposes as the officers of the Church may determine.

7th It is my will that the remainder of my estate or whatever amounts shall may be left after paying the legacies mentioned in the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th clauses of this my will be equally divided between my three sisters Martha, Margaret & Laura Daughton, Sue A. Hodge and Antonio McQuinn Stone and Mary Bell Pennington. That is in my will that whatever this amount may be, that it be divided into four parts, the three daughters to have one - Sue A. Hodge one - Antonio McQuinn Stone one - and Mary Bell Pennington one - the share of the latter being for the sole use benefit and maintenance of herself & children.

I hereby constitute and appoint James McQuinn of the City of Cincinnati my Executor and it is my will that he shall not be requested to execute my bond usually required of Executors and I hereby fully authorize and empower him to sell and make conveyance of my land held or owned by me jointly with Nora P. Anthony & Susan W. Taylor and to do any and all things necessary and requisite to carry into and execute this my will, and in the event that the said McQuinn may ask as Executor, then I fully authorize and empower him to appoint and name some one as my Executor.

in all places who shall have all the power and authority hereby given and granted to the said heirs.

Will of Aaron Hall

I hereby will and bequeath to my son Russell Hall or his heirs and I desire and bid of him that he shall be prudent and economical and that he will not waste or squander the said estate when it shall come into his possession.

After my death I hereby authorize and request my wife to select an Administrator for my estate and request the County Court to confirm said selection as made by her.

In case my wife shall fail to select an Administrator then I hereby request the County Court to select a good and reliable man as my Administrator who will faithfully and honestly carry out all the provisions of this Will.
