In the name of God Amen:

I Barbara Back of the County of Henderson and State of Kentucky do hereby make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills made by me. I own two lots in this city lying on the north side of eighth street between Elm and Green streets the one I bought of Mrs. Delker being deed & to me & my children and the other one which I bought of Mrs. Cunningham being deeded to me as my separate estate with power to dispose of it by will or deed I have also accumulated some personal property by my own labor and independent of my husband George Back; I wish I desire that my just debts & burial expenses be paid by my executors hereinafter named, Second: I desire that the lot I bought of Mrs. Delker is so divided between my three youngest children, that my two daughters have the double house on the East side of the lot, Thereupon to have the west side and half and Rose the east side and half that my son Ben have remainder of said lot namely the small two story frame and the ground which it covers running back the full depth of the lot, Then I desire to my two sons William and John the lot I bought of Mrs. Cunningham, John to have the west half & with standing on it and William the eastern half, But if John & William shall not consent to this agreement & release to my said two daughters and son Ben all their interest in the lot I

I bought of Mr. Laker then they shall not have the house I let I bought from Mrs. Birmingham but the same being equally to all of my children. Third as the house I let above devised to my son John is worth more than the vacant half devised to William I direct that John shall whenever William wishes to build on his half pay to him one half the value of the house standing on the most half as it may be at the time of my death. Seventh all the real estate above devised to my children is for their life or lives with remainder to their children and that given to my daughters is to be their separate estate free from ^{any} liability or control of any husband whom either of them may marry. Eighth I hereby appoint the Anderson Trust Company my executors to carry out this my last Will and Testament and Guardian for my children which are under age I also request that my sons shall consult my above named executor in regard to the transaction of their business. At Edinburgh the twelfth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighty nine. We do hereby after enrolment was presented for registration in the Books of the Lords of Council and Session for presentation and is registered in the said books as follows - Patrick Hamilton - merchant in Glasgow, make this my will that is to say: I bequeath to my brother - George Hamilton Merchant in Glasgow the whole meane and Estate movable and moveable that I shall belong to me at my death and I appoint him my sole Executor. But these bequests are granted under burden of payment of any legacies. I may bequeath by any separate writing under my hand however informal the same may be & I dispense with delivery hereof - Written with my own hand and signed by me at Glasgow this thirteenth day of February, Eighteen hundred and seventy three (Signed) Patrick Hamilton

I, Robert Berry Esquire, Advocate Sheriff of the County of Lanark considering that the late Patrick Hamilton otherwise Patrick James Hamilton - Tobacco Merchant and Importer - Glasgow and residing at Pond, Mariborough Terrace - Kilmarnock, here died at Glasgow upon the eleventh day of March - Eighteen hundred and eighty nine and that by his holograph Testament dated the thirteenth day of February 1873 and Extract whereof from the Books of Council and Session registered on 18th March 1874 and recorded in my Court Book upon the twelfth day of June Eighteen hundred and eighty nine, the said Patrick James Hamilton nominated and appointed his

William Hill N.P. his brother George Hamilton Tobacco Merchant and Importer in Glasgow to be his executor and that the said George Hamilton has given up on oath, an inventory of the personal Estate and Effects of the said Patrick James Hamilton - situated in Scotland & England amounting in value to nearly Five thousand Eight hundred and twenty two pounds eighteen shillings and six pence which inventory as before written has likewise been recorded in my Court Books of date the twelfth day of June Eighteen hundred and
