Fifth I further will and bequeath the sole entire estate I may have of all kinds after death settlement of all just claims against my estate is paid to my brother Samuel Ward for the reason he has had all the trouble with me since the death of my husband. This my last will and Testament made by me and assigned this the sixth day of June 1878

The above Will consisting nearly one sheet was now here subscribed by Elizabeth Yates in the presence of each of us and was at the same time declared by her to be her last Will and Testament, and once at her request assign our names her to as attesting witnesses
