Woodruff all of my entire property real and personal, including all choses in action debts and demands due me, as well as my entire interest in any and all property to which I may be entitled or which I may hold an interest to her own separate use and benefit with full power to dispose of the same by will or deed, my object being to devise to her in fee simple all real property and to give to her absolutely all my entire estate and interests of every character, subject only to the payment of my debts. P³rd I appoint my wife Elizabeth B. Woodruff and my Brother in Law John Hunt respectively Executors and Executor of this will and request that no bonds or security be required of them or either of them for the discharge of their duties. I Jerriss S. Beatty of the City of Henderson Ky do make this my last will & testament. P¹st I direct that all my debts be paid out of any money on hand or collection of money due, (2nd) I give my beloved wife Susan, one half of my estate for and during her widowhood and at the termination of which by death or otherwise the said property shall be equally divided between my two children Ann & Sarah Beatty (3rd) I give the other half of my estate to my said two children to be equally divided between them and should either of them die under age without leaving issue then her share shall go to her sister, (4th) The share given to my wife shall include all my house-hold goods rather visible personal property it being my wish that there sh. all be no sale of my assets or personal property. P⁵th The division of my estate shall not take place until my wife or one of my daughters or my two daughters shall desire it (that is live of the three if they be all alive if not then one shall be sufficient to effect a division) (6th) If at any time my said wife shall desire to sell any of the real estate constituting her share, or it should be necessary to sell any of my real estate to effect a division of my estate, in that event I appoint my friend Jno. W. Barret & husband to make said sale and to hold the proceeds of the part allotted to my wife and to invest the same so that it will yield the best income, which income shall be paid to my said wife semi-annually or oftener if possible for the period designated in the second clause aforesaid of this will, in making said investment, safely shall be considered of first importance & before degree of profit.
