Rebards, but in the event of her marrying again, it is my will that she shall have one third of my personal property in the State of Kentucky, and the income of one third of all my real estate in the State of Indiana during her natural life, and the other two thirds, it is my will is to go to the lawful children of said wife, and at her death all my property, as to heretofore disposed of both real and personal whether in the State of Kentucky or State of Indiana to descend to my lawful children by my said wife Mary S.

When my husband Samuel Stiles bought the Langley farm for
our son Richard he had not the money to pay for it, and I paid
\$3000 (three thousand dollars) on it & had that much of the land
deeded to me, which I relinquished all my right & title to when
he (Richard) sold it to Mrs. Martin Rucker. Richard also borrowed
\$1000 (one thousand dollars) from me a part of which he has used
for my benefit & if any of it should be left at my death I wish
him to see that my old servant Phely shall not suffer & that
she shall be decently buried. I have given my daughter Rebecca
Elam my interest in the Hardacre farm which I valued
when I gave it to her at \$2500. (Two thousand five hundred
dollars.) I have \$4000 (Four thousand dollars) in the bank
of Kentucky located in Louisville, the half of which I wish at
my death to go to my daughter Lucy A. Darrah & the other half
to my grand daughter Susanna Day, daughter of my eldest
daughter Mary Cameron Hanson deceased. I have a note on
Hollaway, Hopkins & Stiles for \$200 (two hundred dollars)

of stock in the Farmers Bank of Kentucky & \$1000 (one thousand
dollars) in the hands of my son in law James C. Darrah for which
I have no note, & after all my debts are paid, I leave every
thing that may be over whether of note or money, in trust
to my two daughters Rebecca McElam & Lucy A. Darrah to be
disposed of as I shall hereafter specify
January 2nd 1872.

James Darrah paid \$250. (Two hundred & fifty) of the money he
owed me for my subscription towards buying the old Farmer
Bank as a Parsonage for the Presbyterian Church.

R. D. Stiles.

I wish to be paid out of the money I leave in trust to my
daughters Rebecca McElam & Lucy A. Darrah six hundred
dollars to my cousin Rebecca D. ^{Fullaway} ~~Elam~~ one hundred dollars
to Mrs. Helen Henry one hundred dollars each as a loving re-
membrance to my daughters Ann Mary Stiles, Rebecca McElam,
Lucy A. Darrah & my niece Lizzie Taylor, & one hundred dollars
to my pastor for preaching my funeral. If there shall be any
surplus after paying my debts & bequests I wish it retained
in the hands of my daughters Rebecca & Lucy for the benefit
of my ~~dearest~~ daughter Mary Cameron Stiles, the interest
spent for her benefit each year & on her marriage or becoming
of age the whole to be paid to her.
