I having agreed & bound myself in writing to remain responsible as surety on the note held by Brown just so long as he would wait on my son John P Sandefur for the payment thereof. with the residue of the purchase - may after the payment of Brown & Clark, my wife shall purchase another house & lot to be held by her as the other for her life time with remainder to my children & their descendants as above provided.
