

of Malinda Schaeffer of the City of Henderson, Kentucky, do hereby make certain and publish this instrument as and for my last will and testament. First, I direct the payment of such debts and claims of funeral expenses as may be owing by me at the date of my decease. Second, I give, devise, and bequeath unto my beloved son George Dallaway Schaeffer (my only child) my tract of farming land, lying in Daviess County, Kentucky, in area containing about two hundred and forty acres and being the same tract which I received by inheritance from the estate of my deceased Father John H. Gallaway. Also I give devise and bequeath unto my son the lot of ground together with the brick store house situate thereon lying on the West side of Main Street between Washington and First Streets in the City of Henderson, Ky. which lot lies adjacent to the lot of Wm. Cole and on the north side adjoins the lot of C. M. Mayers & Co. It being the same lot & property which I purchased at deceased sale, and which at this time is occupied by J. H. Stearns (a tenant). I also devise & bequeath unto my said son my interest in the house & lot lying on the same square, on the west side of the same street, and said city now occupied by lots as a farmstead in which I have dwelt but which he inherited from his Father subject to my devise. But in the event of a sale of said house and lot, to be now contemplated by lots of us) then I devise to him each part of my interest in the proceeds thereof, as may remain or be realized at the time of my decease. Third, I give devise and bequeath unto my said son all my personal property of every character & kind, and all property in which I may have any interest (now and ought the property mentioned in the fourth paragraph of this will) including silverware, furs, &c. I give and bequeath unto my aforementioned son Malinda Ann Dallo all my jewels, jewelry and wearing apparel. I urge upon my son that he shall be prudent, contented and thoughtful in the care and management of the real estate I have thus devised to him, I place no restrictions upon his right to sell or dispose of it for his own advantage, & in the manner he deems best, but only desire that he shall not waste or squander it. I further devise that he during his life shall endeavor to keep in his possession the portion of his Father (my late husband) and that of Sister, I appoint my son George Dallaway Schaeffer, the Executor of this will and request that the Court granting probate of this instrument shall permit him to qualify as such Executor without surety on the Executors bond. Finally, I wish that no abatement be made of any personal property. Witness the hand of Deceasee this 15th day of October 1889.
