

the interest of such devise as may have been disposed by Will but no such disposition shall take place until the death of the last survivor. If no descendant survive said devisees and no disposition be made of said residence by Will, it shall upon the death of the last survivor vest in my heirs according to law. Should my daughter or either of them marry, the property herein bequeathed to them shall in no wise be subject to the control or liable for any contract or debt of their respective husbands but shall be their separate estates.

Section 8 I hereby appoint my son Rev Joseph M. McCullagh my Executor and direct that he be allowed to act without security and in case of his death, I hereby request and authorize him to appoint either by Will or otherwise some truly and reliable person who shall succeed my son in the office of Executor.

Section 9 I direct that no inventory appraisement or sale either public or private be made of my furniture books pictures or any articles in my house. I further direct that no inventory schedule or valuation be made of the property real personal or mixed bequeathed in this my last Will and Testament, written wholly in my handwriting and signed by myself this Eleventh day of January (1857) Eighteen Hundred & Eighty Seven.

Knowing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death, I wish to have my earthly affairs attended to I therefore make the following disposition of my property First I give and bequeath to my wife J. S. Dorsey my home place with the horse lot and field adjoining it, which runs out to the Henderson road which field contains about ten acres, also the house and lot known as the Elmore house said lot contains one acre of ground and lays just out side the corporate limits of Corydon and the road leading out from 7th cross street of Corydon on which street the Baptist Church is located. Also the horse and lot in Corydon located on Sixth cross street near the Coal shaft in which house one Johnson now lives and also my horse and buggy one cow & calf (name Broomy) the sheep and poultry and my five hogs my house hold and kitchen furniture bed and bedding except the Parlor and Chamber room furniture all of which I give to her during her life time or as long as she remains my widow. The remainder of my property I want divided equally among my children after they are all made equal with John he has received some more than the other children. I have the receipt of child for the amount advanced, and at the death of my wife her part of my estate is to be equally divided among my children. Anna is to have the Old homestead, all this work of division I want done by John S. Dorsey or Dr. J. H. Powell, there is no use of going to much expense for the property can be divided by the heirs, of course I want them or either of them compensated for their services of supervision, as witness my hand—
