

I, John Drigg of Henderson County Ky make and publish this as my only last Will and Testament

(1) After the payment of my funeral expenses and any debts I may owe I give the whole of my personal estate to my wife Ann Eliza Drigg I also give and bequeath to my said wife the Home Tract of land on which we now live made up of several purchases including the Baxter & Chatham tract the W. B. Drigg tract and others containing in all about 400 acres. To have and to hold for and during her natural life, but she may dispose of the whole or any part thereof by last Will and Testament with this exception that my grandchild Robert Drigg shall be the only child of my deceased daughter Bettie Glass shall at the death of my wife have in fee simple such part of said Home Tract as shall equal the then average value of the devices hereinafter made to my four children the intention being to make my said grand child equal in the distribution of my estate with my said four children my wife may if she thinks best set apart to my said grand child his part or any portion of his part of said Home Tract at any time after he becomes twenty one years old and at the death of my wife should his portion of the Home Tract not have been previously given to him by her. It shall then be laid off to him in such fair and equitable manner as shall best fulfill my purpose.

(2) To my three daughters Jennie, Julia and Josephine, jointly I give and devise the tract of land purchased of J. & W. B. Chatham in 1851 containing 271 acres except 23 acres of said tract hereinafter given to my son Robert Drigg, and I also give to my said three daughters the land purchased of O. B. Dixon in two parcels one containing 180 acres and the other 13 acres and also lots Nos 3 and 4 each containing 13 1/2 acres being a part of the Baxter land conveyed to me by Robt Dixon senior. These tracts containing between 625 and 630 acres I estimate will equalize my three daughters with my son Robert.

(3) To my son Robert H. Drigg I give and devise lots Nos 1 and 2 each containing 104 acres and being a part of the Baxter land conveyed to me by Robt Dixon senior and also the 19 acre tract being also a part of the Baxter land conveyed to me by Robt Dixon senior the said three tracts being the same that Robt now has in his possession and I also give to him a strip to be taken off the Chatham tract of 271 acres by a line beginning at Robt Drigg's line and running parallel with the Grant line to the W. B. Drigg place and so as to include 25 acres.

(4) I have three wards now living with me Sanford, Silas and Walter B. Sides relatives of my wife. In the event they should

remain with my wife until they respectively reach the age of 20 years and are industrious and well behaved they are each to receive as they reach said age a horse saddle and bridle of the value of one hundred and fifty dollars but my wife is to be the sole judge as to whether they or either of them have fulfilled the condition of this bequest and while I desire the said boys to be trained to habits of industry so long as they remain with my wife yet I advise and so far as I can direct that their wages and earnings shall be devoted to their own maintenance including at least five months schooling each year until they are 20 years old.

(5) I appoint my wife to be the executrix of this Will and direct that no security be required of her and that she be not required to file any inventory or appraisement.
