Will of John Harris Dec^d

I know all men by these presents that I John Harris
of the town of Spottsville Henderson County Ky. being of
sound mind and disposing memory make this
my last will and testament hereby revoking all former
wills by me at any time made.

As to all my property, real personal and mixed
of which I shall die seized, or to which I shall
be entitled at the time of my death I bequeath
and dispose of in the following manner: First.

I wish of course, all my just debts and
funeral expenses shall by my executors, hereinafter
named, be paid out of my estate as soon as convenient after
my death.

Second. I give and bequeath to my son W. J. Harris
in trust for my beloved wife Amanda Harris, my
homestead or residence property containing two
and one half acres of land for her use and res-
idence together with all the improvement & income
of one hundred acres of the two hundred acre
tract of land lying on the South West side of the

Spottsville road: Also in trust to my sons W. J. Harris
and John Harris for the use and benefit of my beloved wife
Amanda Harris two thirds of all my personal property
including notes, money, and proceeds of my Executors
sale after my death, and property to be held and invest-
ed by my sons W. J. Harris and John Harris in trust for
my wife Amanda Harris. He to devise and to be paid
the annual income thereof for and during her natural
life.

Third I give and bequeath to my sons W. J. Harris and
John Harris in trust for my daughter Amanda Smith
wife of Jim Smith of Paducah Ky. one hundred
acres of the two hundred acre tract of land lying on the
South West side of the Spottsville Road in Henderson
County Ky. said tract to be divided equally and
as nearly by a straight line as possible, commence-
ing about Henry Jakes pond together with one third
of all my personal estate, money, notes and proceeds of
Executors sale, and my share which I especially
desire her to have, said property to be held by my
sons W. J. Harris and John Harris in trust for my daugh-
ter Amanda Smith for and during her natural
life. They paying to her only the income and annual
interest derived therefrom, and in the event of her death
the said property to be held by my sons W. J. Harris &
John Harris for any child or children the issue of her
body, and surviving her, and to be held in trust for
said child or children until said children or
either of them attain the age of twenty one years
when same shall be paid to them free from the
trust. But should the said Amanda Smith be-
come a widow, her now living husband Jim Smith
dying before her then in that event, I wish all of
the property herein bequeathed to my sons W. J.
Harris and John Harris in trust for her to be given
over to her in fee simple to dispose of as she may
see fit - but this only in the event of her said present
husband Jim Smith dying before her, and in the
event of the death of either of my said sons W. J. Harris
& John Harris before the consummation and com-
pletion of the trust herein appointed to them then
in that event, I wish the survivor to succeed to all
the powers singly appointed herein to both of them.
Fourth After the death of my beloved wife
Amanda Harris, and the expiration of the trust

as would herein for her life I will and bequeath the remainder thereof to my son W. J. Harris that is to say, the homestead or residence consisting of two and one half acres aforesaid, together with and including one third of all the personally money notes &c herein devised in trust to my wife Amanda Harris to have and to hold unto my son W. J. Harris in fee simple forever.

First After the death of my beloved wife Amanda Harris and after the execution of the trusts herein appointed, I will and bequeath the remainder to my son John Harris, that is to say, the one hundred acres of land held in trust for my wife Amanda Harris, together and including one third of all my personal estate money, notes &c devised in trust for my wife for her life. To have and to hold unto my son John in fee simple forever. Lastly I do nominate and appoint my sons W. J. Harris and John Harris to be the executors of this my last will and testament, and in the event of the death of either of them, then I wish the survivor to qualify, and I wish the current or both of them to qualify, without bond.
