Further I declare that I wish my said wife all of my property and estate jointly and severally that may be in my name at my death and she shall take immediate possession of the same and I desire that no person or persons in the part of any one of them shall hinder or obstruct in the part of any one of them. Let no one living that person or persons (I desire to be slaves to me) and I desire to be mine during his natural life subject to the following provisions namely that said land shall not be sold or any debt which he has created or may hereafter create, or if he does it or cut it out in any way then his any of these debts and said shall be paid forthwith of the money given to Mary Jane and further in the event of said said with the land I be sold & money given to Mary Jane. Let no one I desire to be sold at public sale & to the highest bidder on account of said land and do so, in equal payments, the last payment to be paid within ten days of the date of said further desire that so much of the first payment on the land be set apart for the purpose of paying all just debts or claims against her, of any and all necessary expenses incurred of the said land & all of said property and the remainder of said & I desire that after it is collected to be equally divided between said Georgia and Lucy Ann. I further will that after the collection of the said payments in said let no one that the same be divided or disposed of as follows: Fifty dollars to be given to Thomas & back fifty dollars to Edward Jennings and fifty dollars to my son and the remainder to be equally divided between said Maria, Willie, Mary Jane, Georgia and Lucy Ann. Further I will that all such of my debts which I may have at my death be repaid without unnecessary delay to public sale or a sale of twelve months, and my money to be collected and equally divided among said Mary Jane, Willie, Mary Jane, Georgia and Lucy Ann. I desire appoint J. F. Ingram as sole executor of this my last will and Testament. I wish three whom I have named set my hand and seal this 8th day of August 1874

(2d) If I should die before my wife (Mary Dittson) I wish her to remain here on my present farm the remainder of her life. If I will that all of my property both real and personal be kept together for her benefit and nothing is to be disposed of under any account without her full consent, but she can dispose of any of said property she desires to sell so as to live comfortably the balance of her days and I also will that my son James and his wife Agnes Dittson live here with my wife and take care of her, but I want them to be paid a fair compensation for their services provided they remain and take good care of my wife. (3d) After the death of my wife I will that my son James Dittson receive pay for his services in taking care of my wife her life time. (4th) Now I will that all of my property both real and personal be equally divided among all my children here named John A. Dittson, Ann Dittson, James Dittson, Jane Jones (nee Dittson), Lucy Watton (nee Dittson), George Dittson. I hereby appoint & constitute John B. Jones Sr to see that my last will and Testament are carried out according to my wishes and I wish therefore qualify as my Executor to this my last will. Given under my hand this 1st day of May 1874
