 of human life and the absolute certainty of death do now make
 public and declare this my last will and testament, in manner
 following, that is to say.

Item First.

I will, bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Alice C. Hardwick, all
 my property real and personal, money on hand or on deposit, accounts
 notes due and demands, choses in action, articles of value and all
 other property of every nature and description what ever named by me

 Item Fifth. I will, direct and charge the property real and personal
 decedent and willed herein Item First of this will with the following
 That my beloved wife shall be charged with and furnish my adopted
 son Charles Hardwick and Claude Scott with a home with her during
 their minority, that she do so furnish them and each of them
 suitable maintenance and clothing during said time and provide
 them and each of them a suitable and reasonable education
 provided that they or either of them become or should become independent
 mechanically or of their own free will, care and abandon without just
 or proper cause her home then and in that event the one so
 offending shall have no claim to the trust funds set out and
 the said Alice C. Hardwick shall not be held responsible for such
 education, maintenance etc.

Item Sixth. I now state and declare that I make this will having
 a sound mind, and disposing memory and fully understanding my
 relations to the members of my family and moreover generally
 none whatever being neglected, forgotten or omitted by mistake or
 oversight in this will but that the same expresses my will and
 desires absolutely and the above was purposely and intentionally made
 that my estate be directed only as herein directed I make this
 statement to explain that I have not forgotten any one but fully
 hold all and each of them in memory.

Item Seventh. I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my wife
 Alice C. Hardwick, of Crawford County, Indiana, Executor of this my
 last will and testament, fully vesting any and all wills by me
 heretofore made. That it is my will and desire and I now so
 direct that my wife qualify act as executrix of this will without bond
 in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
