Triplett Sales Will and bequeath to her all the Corn, Hay, Cattle and hogs on the Robards farm.

Wm. Soaper I William Soaper of the County of Henderson & State of Kentucky do make and publish the following as and for my last Will & Testament, viz: Item (1) I give and devise to my beloved wife Susan S. Soaper for and during the term of her natural life, the farm and tract of land on which I now reside, situated on the Evansboro Road east of and near the City of Henderson with its appurtenances, also two lots of ground with the Storehouses thereon, situated in the City of Henderson on Main Street, the one adjoining the lot of Suelam & Soaper, and now occupied by W. A. Hopkins, the other on the alley near the Farmers Bank building and now occupied by Richard Stites. I also give and bequeath to her all my household and Kitchen furniture, and family Carriage and horses, also all the stock of every kind and description farming implements, Wagons, gear, provender & provisions which may be on or pertain to the said farm or tract of land above mentioned at my decease, my purpose and intent being that she shall have and enjoy the said premises with everything pertaining thereto without abatement or diminution by my death. I also give & bequeath to her two hundred shares of the Capital stock of the Henderson National Bank, these shares are of One hundred Dollars each and if at my decease they should be below par, I direct that so much money shall be paid her, as will make them of par value and should I be disposed of said stock, or should the said Bank have been wound up before this Will takes effect, then in lieu of said stock there shall be paid to her the sum of Seventy thousand

dollars. The money, Bank Stock & personal property hereby bequeathed to my said wife, are to be her absolute property, and the devise and bequests herein made to her, are to be in lieu of her share in my estate. Item (2) I have heretofore given to my daughter Elizabeth wife of S. L. Hallam Five thousand Dollars in money, the one half of the Lot and Storehouse on main Street, in the City of Henderson, occupied by Suelam & Soaper, at a valuation of Five thousand Dollars One half acre of ground on Elm Street in said City, on which her residence stands, at a valuation of Two thousand five hundred Dollars, and also three negroes Maria at Six hundred Dollars, Ann Eliza at Eight hundred Dollars, & Bethe at One thousand Dollars, with which several sums, amounting to Fourteen thousand Nine hundred dollars, she is to be charged as advance rents in the division and distribution of my Estate. Item (3) I have heretofore given to my son Thomas Soaper Eight thousand Dollars in money, one half of the Store house occupied by Suelam & Soaper at a valuation of Five thousand Dollars, and two negroes, Lucy Ann at Six hundred Dollars, & Ann Eliza at Six hundred dollars with which several sums amounting to Fourteen thousand two hundred dollars, he is to be charged as advancements in the division and distribution of my Estate. Item (4) I give and devise to my sons R. W. Soaper, William Soaper & Harry Soaper as tenants in common the lot of ground in the City of Henderson, above upper Fifth Cross Street and between Main & Elm, containing about three acres, on which my Tobacco Stummary and the buildings appurtenant thereto stand, at a valuation of Twenty four thousand dollars, with one third of which sum being Eight thousand Dollars, each of them shall be charged therefor in the division & distribution of my estate. Item (5) I give and devise to my son Robert W. Soaper, the Store house and lot of ground now occupied by him as a Grocery Store situated on Main Street in the City of Henderson and being the second house & lot above the Store of Suelam & Soaper at a valuation of Ten thousand Dollars with which sum he is to be charged therefor in the division and distribution of my estate. Item (6) I have forty bonds of the City of Henderson, payable to the Evansville Henderson & Nashville Railroad Company or bearer each of the denomination of One thousand Dollars payable thirty years after date and bearing interest at the rate of seven per centum per annum. I give and bequeath ten of the said Bonds to each of my daughters Kate H. Soaper, Maria Anna, and of S. L. Smead, Maria
