Will of Mary Sister Berner

I, Mary Sister Berner of the City of Henderson Kentucky do make, ordain, and publish this will and testament as and for my last Will and Testament (having the capacity to make a will being of sound mind and memory and unmarried)

1st I direct or request the payment of such debts including my necessary funeral expenses as I may owe at the date of my decease, and request my Executor to satisfy himself that said debts are just before he agrees to pay or pays said debts.

2nd I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved niece Mary Sister Wilkie (whose name may be spelled or written as Wilkie or Wilkey) who resides in the State of Indiana not far distant from Huntingtonburg Indiana my house and lot of ground on which my

dwellings is situated, lying on Gate Street in the City of Henderson State of Kentucky lying on the East side of Gate Street being that property which at this date I dwell in & which was conveyed to me by Mrs Barbara Schlampp and husband, by deed recorded in Henderson County Clerk's Office in deed book No 21- page 462. I devise said property to her absolutely in fee

3rd Also I devise and bequeath unto my said beloved niece Mary Sister Wilkie (or Wilkie) all my personal property, chattles and personal effects of every kind and character including my household and kitchen furniture, all my jewelry my watch and chain, my wearing apparel and every other species of property contained now in my aforesaid dwelling except only 1 Orange portbait and one signet ring with a red setting, which 2 articles are to be given to (Al Northcutt) and everything one writing desk of oak which I devise to Etta Schlampp.

4th I give devise and bequeath unto my said niece Mary Sister Wilkie, all my personal property, chattles & effects now contained in the built house on Madison Street in Henderson Ky near the Madisonville Road, which are particularly named in a list of property this day delivered by me to Mr John Schlampp (which list is marked M. H. B. Oct 8th 1894) Also I give and devise to my said niece all other property (personal property) which I may own located in said house on Madison Street (The old Taylor House) the price of which has not been paid in full to the seller of such property. For it is the object of Testatrix not to devise her any furniture the debt on which may exceed the value of the furniture. But if she or her Guardian choose to pay the debt owing on any furniture, then my object is that in that event all the furniture is included in this devise to said niece & in fact all my property, not specially devised herein to others. But the said of Testatrix is not devised to said niece but I devise such said to Etta Schlampp (the daughter of John H. Schlampp) subject to any unpaid balance of a debt owing by Testatrix thereon. 5th I give and devise to my said niece

and all other property real and personal in my own or may own at my decease not specially named above, no matter where same may be located.

(6) I devise to Al Northcut the articles especially named above (the portrait & ring)

(7) I devise to Etta Schlaump the articles of jewelry especially named above -

(8) I constitute and appoint Mr. J. W. Schlaump of Henderson Ky. the Executor of my last will and testament, and request that the Court granting probate thereof will not require him to give security or surety upon the bond required by law to be executed by an Executor - and have full confidence in his integrity.
