I will and direct that all my just debts be paid -

I give and bequeath to my grandson Charles D. Burbank when he becomes of age - my eighth (8) interest in my lands located near the Village of Smiths Mills in Henderson County and known as the "Sugar Tree" farm said interest to be valued and set apart to him when he becomes of age by three disinterested persons chosen by the parties interested or appointed by the Henderson County Court but with this proviso. In case my grandson Charles D. Burbank should die before he becomes of age then the property herein bequeathed to him shall revert to my Estate and be distributed as in Section 4 of this will -

I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Susan B. D. Burbank the sum of Three Thousand dollars to be paid to her when she becomes of age or marries -

I advanced to my son David A. Burbank at various times before his death considerable sums of money which amounts together with the above bequest I consider a fair and equitable portion of my estate -

The remainder of my Estate both real personal and mixed wherever located and including my Bank of England Stock I give and bequeath to my two daughters Anne F. Burbank and Mary F. Burbank and my son J. C. D. Burbank to be equally divided between them

and benefit free from the control of any husband she may have and at her death the same shall go to her ^{own} children -

3^d. To my grandsons H. Thomas Kelly Cadmus Kelly and Titus Kelly children of my daughter Sarah A. Kelly died I give and bequeath all of my farming lands of every description owned by me at my death subject to the annuity of \$750⁰⁰ heretofore devised to my wife Sylvanus Hunter and which is to be a lien thereon but one of said devisees may have said land divided take possession of his part thereof and rent out or work same provided he pays his proportionate annuity -

4th. Should any children be born to me they are to share equally with my said grand children and stepdaughters the portions herein devised them -

5th. Should one of my grand children die without issue the property herein devised him is to go to his surviving brothers should either of my stepdaughters die without issue the property herein devised her shall go to her sister and should both of them die without issue the property herein devised to them shall go to my said grand children -
