

I, E. H. Horsham of Henderson County and City being now sick and weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory do make this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills I may have made heretofore in manner and form as follows:

It is my wish and desire that all my just debts shall be paid first and as soon as possible after my death by my Executor hereinafter named when properly proven and presented according to law.

2. After all my just debts are paid I will and bequeath all my real and personal Estate to my beloved wife Mariam J. Horsham during her natural life all my real and personal property to be controlled used and enjoyed by her as she may deem best and at her death I will and bequeath that all of the property shall be equally divided between my four children: to wit: A. J. Horsham, Lucian Horsham, D. H. C. Horsham and William E. Horsham subject to provision. That is I have advanced to all of my children some money from time to time for some of the money as advanced. I have thus noted for the same and after the death of my wife in settling my estate between my four children I wish each charged with the amounts so received by them so as to make my child in all equal or near as it is possible but for any advancement made to my children evidenced by note or otherwise it is my will that in any settlement between them, neither shall be charged with interest in said settlement but charged at the date of such advancement. If any of my children should die leaving no child or children living then it is my will that the interest of such shall be equally divided between my then living children or the survivors and the children of such as may have died:

3. I have a tract of land in Lake County Tennessee and a tract of land in Obion County Tennessee and I hereby empower my Executor and authorize my Executor to sell and convey either or both of said tracts of land and make conveyances therefor to pass title in as full and complete manner as I could myself if

living and also empower my Executor to make and make to either sell and convey any or all of my real estate in Kentucky as she may deem best for the interest of said Estate and said conveyance or conveyances so made by her shall pass all title or interest as though made by me.

4. I appoint my beloved wife Mariam J. Horsham Executor of this my last will and testament and having the fullest confidence in her ask the County Court of Henderson County to require no bond of any kind from her. Given under my hand this 1st day of Dec 1890.
