Will of Mary V. Kriel

I, Mary Vogel Kriel of the County of Henderson and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and disposing memory do make and publish this my last will and testament

1st I will and devise to my son John Kriel my present residence on Green Street and the house and lot adjoining on the corner of Green & Dixon Streets - My said residence may be used by my husband John Kriel so long as he remains unmarried free of rent, and my said son is to reside with him during minority free of board - If my said husband should marry again then he is to pay a monthly rent for my said residence if he chooses to occupy same.

2nd I will and devise to my said husband my two houses and lots on Dixon Street for and during his natural life with re-

mainder to my said son, but if he should die before his father and without leaving a wife & child surviving him then his father shall own said two houses and lots as for example I further devise to my said husband a note I hold on my brother A. M. Vogel and also my stock in a Building & Loan Association of Atlanta Georgia, but he is to pay off the note executed to complete my said residence - amounting to \$700 to Mrs. C. Hays Ex².

4th If my said son should die unmarried and without issue before his father, then his father is to have the said two houses on Green Street for and during his natural life with remainder after his death one half to my three nieces Mary M. Munger, Alice Munger Kintner, and Agnes May Nightingale and the other half equally to my four nephews - Edmund H. - W. B. - Frank, and Fred A. Munger.

5th I direct that my Executor and Guardian of my said son, shall hold the property herein devised to my said son in trust for him until he arrives at the age of (21) twenty one years, and only pay over to or for him the rents & income therefrom, but after he becomes (21) twenty one years of age he may manage control & dispose of said house and lot on the corner of Green & Dixon Street as he may desire, and also my present residence on Green Street.

6th I direct that all my house hold furniture shall remain in my residence as it is now for the benefit of my husband & soon my sons, gold watch and jewelry I devise to my said son.

7th I nominate and appoint my said husband Executor of this will, and Guardian and trustee for my said son -

Will of J. H. Ligon

Know all men by these presents, I James Washington Ligon of Henderson County State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing mind and memory, do make and publish this my last will and testament revoking and annulling and voiding all other last wills and testaments heretofore made by me.

First, I desire that my son Bedford Dempsy Ligon continue to cultivate and gather and harvest the crops as agreed upon by my self and him, and sell the same, or such part of it as is necessary, and collect money for same, and pay all my just debts and if he is at any expense in hiring help or in any other way he is to charge me or my estate with half of same.

Second I desire that said Bedford Dempsy Ligon, shall some time during the later part of the present year after he is done harvesting his crop, gather together all my personal property of every description, and dispose of same, either by public or private sale, as he may think best.

Third, I desire that said Bedford Dempsy Ligon, shall take charge of both my farms and use and cultivate the same for a term of three years, beginning the first of January 1896 paying each rent as may be agreed upon by himself and my son John Morgan Ligon. After the expiration of three years, said Bedford Dempsy Ligon and John Morgan Ligon, whom I hereby appoint as executors of this will and testament, to be qualified without bond, shall sell all my real estate, at public or private sale, as in their judgement may seem best, and divide the proceeds equally between my lawful heirs after having charged my daughter Camora Ann Ligon with having received three hundred twenty eight dollars and with legal interest.

From July the first 1893, until the final settlement of my estate, a receipt for which will be found among my papers, also charging the heirs of my deceased daughter Clara (Clara Jones), with three hundred dollars, for the taking care of two children for a term of three years, said three hundred dollars to draw legal interest from January the first 1893 until the final settlement of my estate.

Fourth, I have made a verbal contract with J. H. Dunton in which I have agreed to sell said J. H. Dunton a small piece of land containing about one half acre more or less and lying between said Dunton and J. C. King and outside of my meadow land at present, for which said J. H. Dunton is to pay me at the rate of forty dollars per acre. I desire this contract to be fulfilled by my executors. said Dunton to have a deed to and possession of same when he pays for said land. I also desire that one acre of land including the family burying ground, to be laid off in a square and to reach the line between me and J. C. Sandifer also there must be reserved a right of passway from said burying ground and along the line to the corner of my land near John H. Riggs residence said land to be used for burying purposes.

Fifth, I desire that J. C. Jones, J. H. Spencer, J. H. Conry and J. H. Swann shall give no directions concerning the settlement of my estate or the adjustment of my affairs in any way.

Sixth, After said Bedford Dempsy Ligon, has disposed of the present crop and all my personal property and paid all debts and expenses, if there is any money left in his hands, he shall have the right to use the same by paying legal interest on it, otherwise he shall deposit it in Bank until the final settlement.
