

Know all men by these presents, That Whereas, I Mary McRoy, being now a "Bene Soli", in sound health, both in body and mind, and knowing the certainty of Death, and the uncertainty of life, do hereby make this my last Will and Testament:— 1st It is my will and desire, that at my Death all of my just debts, and burial expenses shall be paid, out of any money that I may have on hand at the time of my Death, And if there is no money on hand at my Death, Then my Executor shall use such of my estate as is now available for that purpose.— 2^d I hereby give and bequeath to Miss Nannie Thomas infant daughter of Evan Thomas and Ann Thomas his wife, The said Nannie Thomas being now about twelve years old, and next to the youngest child, her parents have, All of the estate of whatever kind and character that I may die possessed of whether the same be real, personal or mixed, to have and to hold the same forever, to her own separate use, and free from the use or control of her said parents, or either of them, Also free from the use and control of any husband that she may hereafter have, It is also my desire, that the said Nannie Thomas shall have full power to dispose of said estate, or any part of it, by gift or will, over though she may be married at the time of making said gift or will, and that the consent of any husband she may have to such gift or will shall not be necessary to the validity of the same. — 3. In case the said Nannie Thomas shall die before I do, or in case she the said Nannie Thomas shall die after I do, leaving surviving her no child or children, and without having made any disposition of the property herein devised then in that case it is my will and desire that the whole of it shall go to her sister Catherine Thomas, commonly spoken of and called Katie Thomas. — 4. I hereby appoint Evan Thomas, and Ann Thomas Executors of this my last Will and Testament, and desire that they or either of them that may qualify shall so manage and control said estate as to preserve it to the separate use of the said Nannie Thomas, and as much as to preserve it free from the control, claims, or debts of her husband. —

Being of sound mind and disposing memory, I Annie A. Bacon, do make and sign this as my last will and testament. First I will my soul to God in the name of Jesus Christ Amen! Next I devise and will my house and lot with every thing thereon, including all household goods, being on Powell street between Main and Water in the City of Henderson, Ky; and all other property or means owned by me unto my beloved Sister Mrs Ellen B Walbridge, in trust for the following use and purposes, To have and hold said property in trust for the use and support of my daughter Annie Bacon, and to pay my just debts any balance over which to be divided equally between my sons W. P. Bacon and Thornley B. Bacon, my said Sister Mrs Walbridge shall have the choice and right in carrying out the trust expressed herein, either to rent said home place and devote the rents there to, or to sell same, invest the money therefrom and use the income thereof. She Mrs Walbridge shall also have choice and right to use or sell any of my personal property for the carrying out of the trust herein, In case of the death of my daughter Annie Bacon then Mrs Walbridge shall deliver and surrender to my sons W. P. Bacon and Thornley B. Bacon one half each of said property or its representative, or if either of them be dead then to the one living, or if both be dead without heirs then said property shall go as law directs, In case my daughter Annie Bacon shall marry then Mrs Walbridge shall divide said property or its representative equally between my children W. P. Bacon, Thornley B. Bacon, and Annie Bacon, and in case either of my sons then be dead to go to the surviving heirs as law directs, my object being to provide a bare support for my daughter Annie so long as she lives, unmarried, in case of marriage my property to descend as though I had died intestate or in case of my daughter Annie's death while unmarried then my property to go as though I had died intestate, thus allowing all of my children to share alike, I desire that no bond or surety be required of Mrs Ellen B. Walbridge, in the execution of this will and her trust signed by me 2nd July 1885.
