I, Samuel Dupree, being now of sound mind, but weak in body, do now make and publish this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking any and all other wills by me heretofore made. Now in as much as my wife Anna Dupree did about 1873, abandon me, and has since that time married another man, and live with him as his wife, therefore, I do not desire that she shall have any part of my estate and I leave her nothing whatever, 2 and whereas my daughter, if she be now living, left me at the same time her mother did and has since that time refused to live with, or recognize me and has refused to visit me. Now therefore I give to her (Maggie Dupree) one dollar and this is all of my estate I wish her to have, 3 and whereas I am justly indebted to James McLaughlin of the City of Henderson Ky. in a large sum and he is surety for me in a further sum of \$2250.⁰⁰ and in further consideration of the fact, that I am now sick, not able to work and said James McLaughlin is the only

friend I have on whom I can rely for assistance, and whereas the said McLaughlin, agrees to furnish me in the future as he has in in the past (I having no money at all) with whatever my condition may require, and to furnish me decent burial at my death, Now in order to in some measure to reimburse him for his out lay on my behalf, as well as to save him harmless as far as I am able on his surety-ship aforesaid as well as in recognition of the fact that he has proved himself to be the best friend I ever had, I hereby give and bequeath to him, all the property of which I may die possessed, whether the same be real personal or mixed, and whether it be situated in Henderson Ky. or elsewhere, to have and to hold the same to him this heirs forever, in fee simple, 4 I request the said James McLaughlin to give to my brother Joe Dupree of Versailles Ky. and Richard Woodridge of Lawrenceburg Ky. and my sister Betsey Perry of Louisiana, each a 2 1/2 dollar gold piece as a remembrance of me 5 I appoint James McLaughlin executor of this my will and request that he be qualified without surety. In testimony I have signed this will in presence of Tho. E. Ward and J. R. Ray this 29 day of June 1885 upon the reading of this will to me, I directed the word (Dupree) where it occurs to be changed to (Dupes) which was done before I signed.
