

I bought of Mr. Laker then they shall not have the house I let I bought from Mrs. Birmingham but the same being equally to all of my children. Third as the house I let above devised to my son John is worth more than the vacant half devised to William I direct that John shall whenever William wishes to build on his half pay to him one half the value of the house standing on the most half as it may be at the time of my death. Seventh all the real estate above devised to my children is for their life or lives with remainder to their children and that given to my daughters is to be their separate estate free from ^{any} liability or control of any husband whom either of them may marry. I have hereby appointed the Anderson Trust Company my executors to carry out this my last Will and Testament and Guardian for my children which are under age I also request that my sons shall consult my above named executor in regard to the transaction of their business. In witness whereof I hereunto set my hand the presence of Dr. Ben. Fisher & Mrs. Theresia Muller also J. H. Priest this 17th day of December 1870.

On March 23rd 1871 a paper purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Barbara Bach late of Henderson County Kentucky was produced in open court and the motion to probate same was continued for proof. On March 26-1871 said paper was proven by the oath of J. H. Priest, Theresia Muller and Ben. Fisher subscribing witnesses thereto. Thereupon the same was adjudged to be the true last Will & Testament of Barbara Bach and ordered to be recorded as such which is here done. Attest. J. H. Hart. Clerk.

At Edinburgh the twelfth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighty nine. He doth herein after subscribed was presented for registration in the Books of the Lords of Council and Session for presentation and is registered in the said books as follows - Patrick Hamilton - merchant in Glasgow, make this my will that is to say: I bequeath to my brother - George Hamilton Merchant in Glasgow the whole means and Estate movable and moveable that I shall belong to me at my death and I appoint him my sole executor. But these bequests are granted under burden of payment of my legacies. I may bequeath by any separate writing under my hand however informal the same may be & I dispense with delivery hereof - Written with my own hand and signed by me at Glasgow this twelfth day of February, Eighteen hundred and seventy three (Signed) Patrick Hamilton

J. Robert Berry Esquire, Advocate Sheriff of the County of Lanark considering that the late Patrick Hamilton otherwise Patrick James Hamilton - Tobacco Merchant and Importer - Glasgow and residing at Pond. Marchbrough Terrace - Kilmarnock, here died at Glasgow upon the eleventh day of March - Eighteen hundred and eighty nine and that by his holograph Testament dated the thirteenth day of February 1873 and Extract whereof from the Books of Council and Session registered on 18th March 1874 and recorded in my Court Book upon the twelfth day of June Eighteen hundred and eighty nine, the said Patrick James Hamilton nominated and appointed his

his brother George Hamilton Tobacco Merchant and Importer in Glasgow to be his executor and that the said George Hamilton has given up on oath, an inventory of the personal Estate and Effects of the said Patrick James Hamilton - situated in Scotland & England amounting in value to nearly Five thousand Eight hundred and twenty two pounds eighteen shillings and six pence which inventory as before written has likewise been recorded in my Court Books of date the twelfth day of June Eighteen hundred and

eighty nine - Therefore I in her Majesty's name and authority - Ratify approve and confirm the nomination of Executor contained in the foregoing holographic Testament and I give and commit to the said George Hamilton full power to accept, receive, administer and dispose of the said personal estate and effects grant discharges thereof if needful let pursue therefore and generally every other thing concerning the same to do that to the office of an Executor. Nominate is known to belong - Protesting always that he shall render just count and reckoning for his administrations herewith when and where the same shall be legally required. Given under the seal of office Commissions of Lanarkshire & signed by the Clerk of Court at Glasgow the fifteenth day of June Eighteen Hundred and eighty nine - signed (Ed. Allan)
