Will of Peter Bom

I Peter Bom of Henderson County Kentucky do make ordain and publish this instrument as and for my last will and testament I hereby revoking and cancelling a former will made by me on or about the date of November 17th 1894

First. I direct the payment of such just debts as may be owing by me at the date of my decease as well as a reasonable sum to defray my funeral expenses and if my executors shall have a doubt as to the justice of any demand which may exist against my estate it is my suggestion and advice that he will seek legal counsel or advice where such debt be adjusted

Second. I give devise and bequeath unto my son Jacob Bom John Bom and unto my daughter Louisa McQuire (wife of James McQuire who now resides in the City of Evansville Indiana (excepting only the bequest to my said daughter hereinafter mentioned) to each of my said three children one third of all my property real personal and mixed which I may own at my decease and to each of said three children an equal share in any and all debts or demands which may be owing to me and in which I may have any interest and to each an equal share in any interest I may be entitled to in any property whether

or not it may then be in my possession or control

At the date of this will my real estate consists of a tract of farming land lying in Henderson County conveyed to me by Montgomery Merritt & wife & J. J. Farmer wife see deed book 8 page 550 and a tract of land lying adjacent thereto recently purchased from Bassett & Co

Third. I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Mary Brown now residing in Evansville Indiana Fifty Dollars (\$50) in money to be paid to her by the Executor of this Will as soon as he may conveniently pay same after his qualification as Executor which bequest is to be in full of any interest she might expect to receive in my estate Fourth I constitute and appoint my son Jacob Bom the Executor of this my last will and testament and request that the Court granting probate of this will and admitting it to record shall not require my said Executor to give surety or Security upon any bond as Executor But that he may qualify as such Executor simply upon his personal covenant

Fifth The abovesaid devise to my daughter Louisa shall be to her as her separate estate free from the control or debts of her husband and of any husband to whom at any time she may be married

Sixth If either of my said devisees Jacob John or Louisa die before my decease the share of such one shall pass to and vest in the child or children of my said deceased devisee Witness the hand of Testator this 29 day of October 1892

until the youngest daughter becomes of age - except that

absolutely one third of said property then on hand - in
case of my wife's death all said property is to be used
for support & support of my three daughters untill they
become of age & marry at which time their then
interest in said property ceases and said property is to be
used for the joint & support of said daughters
unmarried & not of legal age. But when all of said

daughters become of age and married. Then said property is
to be divided during to my wife a full one third & the
the remainder in equal parts to my children then
