

Richard Suggs, Henderson County, Kentucky, January the 16th 1890.

Know all men by these presents, that I Richard Suggs in the County and State aforesaid, Gentlemen being in full health and of sound and disposing mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time heretofore made.

First, I hereby constitute and appoint my wife Nancy Suggs to be sole executrix of this my last will, directing my said Executrix to pay all my just debts and funeral expenses, and the legacies hereinafter given out of my estate. Second, After the payment of my said debts and funeral expenses I give to each of my children Richard Suggs and Oscar Suggs the sum of one dollar each to be paid to each of them within one year after my decease but within one year as conveniently may be done - also further more wishing to remunerate my niece Nancy Elmett (whom I raised for her husband to me) I give to her one hundred dollars to be paid to her also one year after the death of my Executrix or Beloved wife Nancy Suggs but within one year as conveniently may be done. Third - And for the payment of the legacies aforesaid I give and devise to my said executrix all the personal estate owned by me at my decease (except my household furniture and wearing apparel, and so much of my real estate as when sold by order of the Court of probate will be sufficient in addition to the same personal estate herein given to pay said legacies. Fourth, I give to my said executrix all my household furniture and wearing apparel for her sole use. Fifth, I devise to my said executrix all the rest and residue of my real estate so long as she may live, with remainder thereof in her devise to my said children and their heirs respectively share and share alike. In testimony whereof, I hereunto set my hand and seal and publish and declare this to be my last will and testament in the presence of the witnesses named below, this 16th day of January in the year 1890.

In the name of God Amen: I Augustus Beck of the County of Henderson and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and disposing memory but realizing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death do make and ordain this my last will and testament hereby revoking any or all wills by me heretofore made.

First, It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid and that my body shall be decently interred -

Second, I devise to my wife Mary Beck in trust for my youngest son Nicholas Beck the tract of land situated across the Creek from the old residence near the bridge on the Madisonville road, the same being heavily wooded more or less, being the same conveyed to me by Lecklet to heirs, said property is to be free from any debt or liability created by the said Nicholas, and in the event he has any Creditors and they seek to subject the same to the payment of their debts, then it is my will
