Mudge my farm messuage and tenement with the appurtenances situate lying and being in Henderson County, to have and to hold unto my said Nephew Henry J. Mudge his heirs and assigns forever, Also, I give and bequeath to my Nephew Augustus D. Blake the sum of two hundred dollars, Also I give and bequeath to my Nephew Alfred A. Blake the sum of two hundred dollars, Also I give and bequeath to my Nephew William R. Blake the sum of two hundred dollars, Also, I give and bequeath to my niece Alice H. Porey the sum of two hundred dollars, Also, I give and bequeath to my Nephew Reed Blake the sum of two hundred dollars, Also I give and bequeath to my Niece Eliza D. Blake the sum of two hundred dollars, Also I give and bequeath to my Niece Elizabeth Kate Blake the sum of two hundred dollars, Also I give and bequeath to my Nephew Frederick Theophilus Blake the sum of two hundred dollars, Also I give and bequeath to my Niece Catherine Jennette Sochet the sum of two hundred dollars, Also, I give and bequeath to my sister Catherine Blake all my household furniture, And I do hereby appoint my Brother in law Theophilus Blake executor of this my last will and testament and do give unto him the remainder of my money or property in consideration of my having advanced a sum and trouble he will have in the execution of this my will, and my will is and I do hereby expressly declare that my said executor shall not be charged or chargeable with, or accountable for more of the aforesaid money or estates than he shall actually receive or shall come to his hands in virtue of this my will or with or for any loss which shall happen of the said money or estates or of any part of my personal estate so as such loss happens without his wilful default or neglect. In testimony whereof I the said Elizabeth P. Agnew have to this my last will and testament subscribed my name and affixed my seal this the 10th day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy eight.

Batte came Henderson County Ky October 31st 1889 - I Robert Bennett Batte believing in Almighty God and his commandments, and knowing that life is uncertain and death is certain, and being in sound mind, but in declining health do make this my last Will and Testament, I give and bequeath to my wife Mary E. Batte all of my real estate and personal property, consisting of one house and lot in Cairo Ky. My present household - What live stock I may have and their increase, all rolling stock I may have, a stock of Dry Goods, Groceries &c. or their proceeds - all money I may have, or to come to me, after my just debts are paid, to use for her comfort and support and the Board and support of my Daughter Maud Batte, so long as she remains a widow, at her marriage all of the above property or what may be on hand or remain then to revert to my Daughter Maud Batte during her life and at her death, to her heirs, if she has any, if none, these said property including every thing, to revert to my Brother and Sisters and their heirs, and I hereby appoint and make my Daughter Maud Batte her own free agent to rule and control said property, at the death or marriage of her mother Mary E. Batte, I also bequeath to my wife, my Life Ins. in the Knights of Honor to be used as the other personal property, that is for her support and that of my Daughter Maud, and I hereby request my wife to to loan my Life Ins. on real estate and only use the interest, but if said interest is insufficient, then she use the Principal, and I hereby appoint my wife Mary E. Batte, my Administratrix without Bond, and give her full power to settle up my debts, without sales of any thing only what she may not want to use or keep, and then it to be sold privately, and I appoint Geo. H. Smith as my wife's legal adviser during her life or her widowhood, and now feeling that I have done my duty to my Family, I leave all things in the hands of Almighty God, and here subscribe my names in his presence and in the presence of three witnesses, This the 31st day of October A. D. 1889.

I, Fredrick Britsch of the City of Evansville County of Vanderburgh and State of Indiana do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking any former wills by me at any time made. Item 1st I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses to be paid as soon after my decease as practicable. My funeral I want to be plain and a plain tombstone to mark my grave. Item 2 I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Julia Britsch all that said Britsch the sum of Five thousand dollars in money or real estate or in both kinds as she may elect and also the furniture bedding Cane etc in the house and as soon as she may desire I reserve the sum of at the time of my death and this is to be paid of her share of my estate in both the real and personal estates left by me at my death this being as I believe equal in value to the amount that she will be entitled to at my death as my widow under the laws of Indiana. Item 3rd All the real and residue of my estate real and personal I give and bequeath to my wife in trust for my children born and unborn share and share alike to be held and managed by her or the trustee of my children and those conditions. I wish my wife shall take possession of the estate herein bequeathed to my children and manage and control the same for their education support and education and I may by such power be sold and convey all or any portion of my estate Real or personal as in her judgement may be beneficial to my children but no sale shall be made or necessary to sell the Real Estate she shall first obtain an order of the Probate Court and make and file a bond with said Court conditional for the faithful application of the proceeds of the sale in accordance

with the terms of this Will That my wife shall pay to each of my children who at the time of my death may be attained the age of twenty one years the sum of Five hundred dollars and to each of the remaining children the same amount of Five hundred dollars when they respectively shall attain the age of twenty one years. Item 4 If any of my children should die leaving children then the portion of such child shall go to his or her children and if any one of my children should die leaving no issue then the portion of such child shall go to my other children share and share alike. Item 5 In case of the death of all my children born and unborn then the whole of my estate remaining at the death of my wife shall go and bequeathed to the next of kin to myself and I intend to my next of kin. Provided that whatever estate I or my children shall receive from my father's estate shall all go to my next of kin. Item 6 I hereby appoint my wife sole executrix of my estate and Testamentary Guardian of my children and request the Court to appoint her as such and that no one be required of her as executor or Testamentary Guardian solely as she remains my widow but if my wife shall marry again after my death then I require that she give to me as such Testamentary Guardian or other Executor and Guardian as required to do under the laws of the State of Indiana and report to the Probate Court that some other suitable person be appointed in her stead. Testimony hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 24th day of June A.D. 1890.
