Know all men that Thomas C. Gallaway of the City and County of Henderson and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory, recognizing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death, do hereby make and ordain this my last will and testament hereby revoking any and all wills heretofore made by me. First it is my desire that my funeral expenses and just debts be first paid. Second I desire that my surplus personal property be first sold by my Executor hereinafter named to pay my funeral expenses and just debts and if not a sufficient amount realized therefrom then such part of my real estate as may be determined on by my wife be sold for that purpose. Third, after the payment of my debts funeral expenses I desire to my beloved wife Martha S. Gallaway, all the rest and residue of my estate of every character and description for and during the period of her natural life or widowhood and in the event of her death or marriage then all of my estate as to descend to and vest in my five children Mary Fredonia Gallaway, Sierra S. Willingham, present wife of Geo. Willingham, Adeline Stites, formerly, Edlin Luther, Sons Gallaway, to be divided equally between them share and share alike such should any of my said children die without issue living at the time of her or his death then the interest devised herein to such child or children shall be divided equally between those living on the ascendants of same. In the event of the death of any child or children the descendants of same shall inherit the share of such child or living at the death or marriage of my wife.

It is my desire that George M. Willingham be the Executor of my Will and I hereby request that he be qualified as such Executor without bond, required to give bond as such Witness my hand this 18th day of November 1895
