After the payment of all my just debts and funeral expenses I will and bequeath to my following children namely, Ovid Thos Jennings Mary & Brickley wife of Jas & Brickley. Chas Leeg and Nancy & Todd wife of J. H. Todd my entire estate, real, personal, mixed or of whatever nature, or wherever located, to be divided among them in equal portions that is share & share alike. Having heretofore given to my son Richd Jennings the farm on which he now resides & he being now present all of my estate - he agreed to ask & take nothing under this my will & he is to have no interest. To be taken through me in any estate of which I may die possessed

- Will of J. J. O'Nan -

I know all men by these presents that Thomas J. O'Nan of the County of Henderson and State of Kentucky (a farmer) Considering the uncertainty of life and being of Sound Mind and Memory. Do make and decree and publish this my last will and testament

First. I devise that the Life policy in New York Life Insurance Company of Three Thousand dollars be collected and the money paid to cancel a mortgage lien held on my farm by the North Western Life & Co. of Three Thousand dollars.

Second. That all my debt be paid out of whatever can be best disposed of for the money whether grain or stock from the farms.

Third. I give and bequeath to my wife Lizzie O'Nan all my property both real and personal so long as she remains my widow or until my youngest child reaches its majority (to age of 21 years) when such child reaches the age of 21 years I desire and request that all the property both personal and real be divided equally between my children, but if my wife is living and is my widow, she is to retain till her death one third of all the property both real & personal.

Fourth. I should there may be enough personally to pay my just debts. I desire that a part of the Mouth tract of land be sold and designate that part lying next to Boardman Creek.

Fifth. I do nominate and appoint my friend James Hanesch as executor of this my last will and testament, who shall act as said executor without bond in testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand & seal, and publish and decree this to be my last will and testament, in the presence of Rev. J. O'Nan and W. D. Oak & J. C. Lums witnesses named below this the 22 day of April in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and ninety eight.
