

Thomas H. Powell, of Henderson County, Kentucky,
being of Sound Mind and Memory, do make and publish this
my last will and testament, revoking all other wills heretofore
made by me.

1. I direct that my executors shall pay all my just
debts out of my estate.
2. I will and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth, during
her natural life, all the land and appurtenances
thereon, of my residence farm lying east of the following
line, viz - Beginning in the line of the Corydon Public
School District in the Canyon and Gaconadiok roads.
Thence with said line South to a point opposite the
North East Corner of my Orchard - thence West with
the line of the fence including the Orchard and on West
with the fence to the bridge across a branch - thence up
the branch to the line of the land of Mrs Mary Nicholas.
3. I will and bequeath to my said wife all our house
hold and kitchen furniture of every description and
character, bedding, clothing, provisions &c - including every
thing now used by us in housekeeping, ornamented and
otherwise, to use, enjoy and dispose of as she may; but
such of said property as she shall not have disposed
of, shall, at her death, descend in equal shares to
my three children - Evaline, Patsy and Ida.
4. I will to my said wife absolutely all my horses except
one - wagons, gearing, buggies, farming implements, grain,
hay, and two cows and calves to be selected by her from
those on hand.
5. I will and bequeath to my daughter Patsy the following
described house and lot in the Town of Corydon Ky,
a part of a lot conveyed to me by Isaac H. Brinkshott and
lying opposite the Mill of R. H. Turner &c - Beginning at the
N. E. Corner of the lot and joining Mrs Drake - thence South
with the street to the fence which runs back and in a
direct line over the center of the mill - thence back or West
with the line of the fence and straight on back to the line
of the lot on the West side, the lot being an oblong square
fronting on the street between this lot and a lot of J. R. Wilson
and running back the entire length of the original lot.
6. I will and bequeath the following sums of money to
the following named persons, to-wit: to my daughter
Evaline, Twenty Five hundred Dollars, to my daughter
Patsy, Fifteen hundred Dollars, to my daughter, Eliza
Seven hundred Dollars - to my daughter Ida seven
hundred Dollars, also to Ida one horse to be selected

by her from those on hand at my death. To my grandchild
Thomas Nicholas Two hundred Dollars, to Selia, Cora, Siggie, Ora &
Stammie Children of my deceased son, Samuel H. Powell
One hundred and twenty five Dollars each.

7. I Appoint my son John H. Powell Trustee of my daughter
Evaline, who shall receive and hold in trust for her support,
and pay out as herein after provided, the bequest to her in
the 6.

8. My wife will take care of and provide for my daughter
Evaline, so long as she my wife may live; and for this
charge upon my wife, I direct that she shall have a
reasonable Annual Compensation which shall be paid
annually by the trustee of Evaline.

9. If Evaline should be living at the death of my wife, I
direct that my executors shall secure a good home for
her, and that whoever shall take care of and provide for her
shall have a reasonable Compensation therefor which shall
be paid annually by her trustee; and if any of this trust
fund should be remaining at her death it shall revert
to my estate.

10. I Appoint my sons John H. Powell and J. J. Powell
Executors of this will and direct that they be faithful
without bond.

11. I direct and empower my Executors to sell either
privately or Publicly, as may seem best to them, all
my Personal and Real Property, not herein disposed of,
the Proceeds of which shall be equally divided between
my lawful heirs.

12. I direct and empower my said executors to sell either
privately or Publicly, as may seem best to them, all
Property, Real or Personal, that may hereafter come to
my estate, including the lands set aside to my wife after
her death, the Proceeds of which shall be equally divided
between my lawful heirs.

13. I will and bequeath to my daughter Ida the following
described house and lot in the Town of Corydon Ky -
a part of the original lot mentioned in sec 5. Beginning
at the South West Corner of the original lot on 5th Street thence
East with the street to a stake half way to the other corner
thence back (on a Parallel line with the line on the West
side of the lot) to the line of the lot given to Patsy in sec 5
thence West with the line of Patsy's lot to the corner - thence
South with the original line to the Beginning.
