Will of Frederick William Brinkmeyer

In the name of God Amen.

I Frederick William Brinkmeyer of the County of Hamilton and State of Ohio, being of lawful age and of sound mind and memory, and under no restraint whatever, do make and publish this my last will and testament - viz:

1st I give and devise to my beloved wife Maria Brinkmeyer, her maiden name was Stencker, all the personal property, goods, chattels, money and credits, which I may own or be entitled to at the time of my death, subject to debts here-
after mentioned.

2nd I give and devise and bequeath to my said wife Maria Brinkmeyer, in lieu of her dower, all the real estate and equitable estate which I may own and to which I may be lawfully entitled, either in this or any other County in

the United States of America, at the time of my death, together with all the privileges and appurtenances to the same belonging, to have and to hold the same to my said wife Maria Brinkmeyer, so long as she remain my widow,

3rd I give and devise, furthermore, to my brother Henry Brinkmeyer the sum of twenty-five (25) Dollars, and to my sister Elizabeth, widow of Henry Storch, late of Cincinnati, deceased, the sum of Twenty Five (25) Dollars, and to my sister Sophia Brinkmeyer wife of Meinwein of Bottbergow, Avient of Secklenburg, Prussia, the sum of twenty-five (25) Dollars, and to William Adolph Herde infant child of my deceased sister Christina Brinkmeyer of Cincinnati, the sum of Fifty Dollars, to be paid to them respectively, out of my above named estate by my executor within one year after my death.

4th If my said wife, after my death, shall again marry, then she shall be confined to her lawful dower, in my said real estate and no more, but if she remain my widow, then, in addition to the life estate to her herein before granted, she is hereby authorized to sell and convey, at such price as she may think proper, so much of my said real estate, as she may need in case of sickness or other necessity, for her own mainenance and support.

5th At the death of my said wife, I give and devise all the property then in consumed, to my children share and share alike.

6th I do hereby revoke all former wills by me made.

7th I do hereby constitute and appoint my said wife Maria Brinkmeyer, executrix of this my last will and testament.

8th If all my children shall depart this life before my said wife Maria Brinkmeyer, then and in that case, my said wife shall be entitled to a life estate in all my real and equitable estate although she may then be married again, any thing in the fourth item hereabove mentioned to the contrary notwithstanding.
