Will

In the name of God Amen. I Wm George Walker of the County of Henderson and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament as follows viz: 1st It is my will and desire that at the time of my death all the debts I may be then owing, shall be paid off and discharged by my executors herein after named as well as my funeral expenses, and for the purpose of so doing, should there not be money enough on hand for that purpose that so much of the personal property as may be necessary, be sold to raise a fund for that purpose.

2nd It is my will and desire that in the event my wife shall survive me, that my entire estate shall be kept together and managed and controlled by my youngest son Adolphus W. Walker for the support and maintenance of himself and his mother and sister Estelle Walker, and that said estate shall be held during the life of my wife, that at the time of her, or at the time of my death should I survive her it is my will and desire that my entire estate both real and personal and mixed shall be equally divided between my said youngest son and my said youngest daughter the aforesaid Estelle but in the event of the death of either them before the division of said estate it is my will that it go as follows, should Adolphus W. die before the said division leaving no legal heirs of his body, then my entire estate shall go to the said Estelle and her heirs if Estelle should die leaving no legal heirs, then it is my will and desire that the interest begun withed herein to her shall be equally divided between her brothers of the full blood. 3rd Should my daughter Estelle after my death and during the life of her mother, or after, then it is my will that out of my estate she shall have at the time of her marriage a good horse saddle and bridle, a good bed bedding, and bed furniture and a good cow and calf, the value of said articles to be deducted from the interest in my estate withed to her, when the division shall be made. 4th It is my will and desire that my son Wm. Walker act as and I hereby nominate him the Executor of this my last will and testament. 5th I hereby revoke absolutely all wills heretofore made by me.

Codicil No. 1, I William A. Walker, being of sound mind and disposing memory made and publish the following, as a Codicil to my will of date August 10th 1874. Item, Having conceived by deed to my son A. W. Walker what I consider his full interest in my estate, I now direct that all the residue of my estate at my death after the payment of my just debts, vest in and belong to my daughter Estelle as directed in my will, that is after the death of my wife should she survive me, and said Estelle or heirs of her body survive us both. Item 2^d, Whereas I have taken, and now hold the notes of my son A. W. Walker for the bond sold him and charged to him as an advancement, I desire that said notes or any of them remaining unpaid at the time of my death and not required to pay my just debts be surrendered to him, I hereby releasing him from the obligation to pay the same, they having been taken only to secure a support for myself and wife during our lives, nothing, but the interest being supposed necessary for that end. I care of my death before the death of my wife and the marriage of my daughter Estelle I direct that my son who is named as executor of this will shall discharge all the duties required of him by said instrument.
