In the name of God amen I Francis Barner of the county of Simpson and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and memory but knowing the certainty of death do make and ordain this my last will and testament as follows (to wit) I do hereby appoint my son Benjamin Barner executor to my will. 1st It is my will that all my debts shall be paid. 2nd I will and bequeath to my four sons, Wiley J. Barner, William Barner, Benjamin Barner and Sterling M. Barner, one dollar each to be paid to them individually by my said executor. 3rd I will and bequeath to my daughter Patsy Barner my bay mare and one third part of flock of hogs cattle and sheep and household & kitchen furniture and farming utensils. 4th I will and bequeath to my daughter Rebecah Barner my sorrel horse colt and one third part of my flock of cattle hogs & sheep and household & kitchen furniture and farming utensils. 5th I will and bequeath to my daughter Macey Barner my chestnut sorrel mare and cream coloured colt, and one third part of my flock of cattle hogs & sheep and household & kitchen furniture and farming utensils. 6th It is my will and desire that my executor shall at his discretion, either hire out my negro man Prince from time to time, or sell and dispose of him for the best price that can be had - and in either case my said executor is hereby required to pay to each of my daughters herein before named an equal part of the money arising therefrom. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 30 day of September 1823
